✓ **New York State Vital Records Update**—A recent issue of the Westchester County Genealogical Newsletter reported that a NYS Vital Records Update was given at the most recent meeting of the New York State Council of Genealogical Organizations (Oct 13-14, 1991). Guest speaker Larry Hackman of the NYS Archives announced that agreements to transfer the copies of the microfiche index to the vital records had been signed. The Archives expects to have the indexes within a few weeks where they will be available to researchers on a first come-first served basis for two hours at a time. Mail requests for index searches cannot be handled by the Archives due to staff shortages. You will have to consult the indexes yourself or hire a local researcher (Albany) to do this for you. These indexes contain the name of the person, the date and place of the event (birth, death or marriage) and the certificate number.

If you do get to Albany, you can also use the indexes

at a new public access genealogy workstation established by the Department of Health in the Health Information Access Services (HIAS) storefront located on the Concourse level of the Empire State Plaza. The workstation will accommodate only one researcher at a time. Up to a 2-hr. appointment can be made by calling 518-486-1677.

You should note, however, that the restored access to the indexes (which cover births 1881-1916, marriages 1881-1941, and deaths 1881-1941) does not solve the problem of the backlog of requests for the actual certificates. You're probably still better off trying to get a copy of the certificate from the local registrar where the event occurred, rather than requesting it through the State Dept. of Health in Albany.

One additional note—as of October 17, 1991 the cost of obtaining an uncertified copy of a vital record for genealogy purposes has increased by \$5 which brings the cost of a request in which the exact date of the event is known, to \$11.00. (If a search must be done of more than 3 years, the fees are higher. Extensive genealogy searches will double in price to \$10 per hour.)

An Associated Press newspaper release in October reported that copies of birth and death certificates from local government sources (town and city clerks) now cost \$10.00 (up from \$5.). The increase was approved as part of the state budget, passed in July. Under the law, local town and city clerks can also raise the price of a marriage certificate copy from \$5 to \$10 upon approval of the local town board or city council.

✓ **Rockland/Orange County "People's Project"**—Jack Focht, Director of Trailside Museum, Bear Mountain, announced there was a "People's Project" in progress gathering information, anecdotes, etc., on people who had lived in North Rockland and nearby Orange County, particularly in areas known as Johnstown, Sandyfields, Pine Meadows and Doodletown. When the project is completed, the information will be made available to libraries and interested organizations.

GSRC BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of the organization shall be The Genealogical Society of Rockland County, New York referred to hereafter as the Society.

ARTICLE II—OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Society shall be as follows:

1. To encourage and promote accurate and thorough genealogical research of every region through educational programs and workshops.
2. To discover, collect, preserve, record, and catalog Rockland County genealogical and historical data and make these records and papers available for study.
3. To prepare and distribute for and to the membership a quarterly publication to include genealogical inquiries from members nationwide and worldwide, plus genealogical articles and hitherto unpublished records such as family Bible records, parish records, census and collections of newspaper obituaries and the like.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the Society shall be open to all persons interested in Genealogy. There shall be the following classes of membership:

Class A: Individual Members upon payment of the annual dues payable in June of each year.

Class B: Family Members upon payment of the annual dues payable in June of each year.

Class C: Corresponding Members, who because of location can not attend regular meetings, upon payment of annual dues in June of each year.

Membership dues shall be determined by the Board of Directors and approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present at a regular scheduled meeting at which a quorum is present.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

A meeting shall be held on a monthly basis with the exception of July and August on the fourth Tuesday of the month, except when the meeting shall conflict with holidays.

A quorum shall consist of ten (10) members in good standing.

An annual meeting shall be held in June for purposes of installation of Officers, Audit Report and Budget presentation.

ARTICLE V—OFFICERS

The following officers shall be elected for a term of one year. An officer may not serve more than two successive terms in the same office.

Any officer missing three consecutive meetings without just cause shall vacate that office.

1. President, whose duties shall be:
 - A. Preside at all regular meetings of the Society and at all Board of Directors meetings.
 - B. To appoint the chairperson of all special com-

mittees.

- C. To appoint the chairperson of all standing committees subject to ratification by the members by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present at a regular scheduled meeting at which a quorum is present.
- D. To be an ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee.
2. Vice President, whose duties shall be:
 - A. In the absence of the President, serve in his stead.
 - B. Program Chairperson.
3. Treasurer, whose duties shall be:
 - A. To receive and deposit all monies of the Society.
 - B. To disburse such funds as provided by the budget and/or voted by the membership.
 - C. To keep a record of receipts and expenditures.
 - D. To present a financial report at all regular scheduled meetings of the Society and at every regular meeting of the Board of Directors.
4. Recording Secretary, whose duties shall be:
 - A. To record the minutes of all Society and Board of Directors meetings.
 - B. To record attendance at each meeting and determine if a quorum be present.
5. Corresponding Secretary, whose duties shall be:
 - A. To notify members of all Society and Board of Directors meetings.
 - B. To handle any necessary correspondence of the Society and keep records of the same.
 - C. To assume the duties of the Recording Secretary in absence of same.

ARTICLE VI—BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors shall consist of the five elected officers and chairpersons of each standing committee.

The quorum for a Board of Directors meeting shall be five.

The Board of Directors shall:

1. Meet quarterly and at any other time deemed necessary.
2. Recommend policies and plans to the membership.
3. Prepare a budget for the annual period June to June which shall be presented to the membership at the annual business meeting.
4. Fill vacancy of office on an interim basis until the next election subject to ratification by the members by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present at a regular scheduled meeting at which a quorum is present.

ARTICLE VII—NOMINATING COMMITTEE

A Nominating Committee composed of three members in good standing shall be appointed by the President in April, with the approval of the Board of Directors. This committee shall prepare a slate of five officers and present the slate to the membership

at the May meeting of the Society. The Corresponding Secretary shall notify the membership of the slate, prior to the meeting. The election of officers shall take place at the May meeting and they shall assume their duties at the annual business meeting in June.

ARTICLE VIII—STANDING COMMITTEES

It is the intent of the Society to have several standing committees to carry out a variety of tasks. The following Standing Committees are recommended:

1. Archivist
2. Audit
3. Membership
4. Research
5. Correspondence
6. Publicity

ARTICLE IX—PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order shall be the Parliamentary authority for procedure in all cases in which they are applicable and not inconsistent with the by-laws.

ARTICLE X—AMENDMENT PROCEDURES

The by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Society, at which a quorum is present, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided that the notice of the proposed amendment shall be given in the call to the meeting at which action is to be taken on the proposed amendment.

ARTICLE XI—DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County, any monies remaining in the treasury, after payment of all debts, and all properties shall be donated to the Historical Society of Rockland County.

Grasping at Straws

Program presented at the June 25, 1991 meeting of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County

Notes by Joan Brooks, Recording Secretary

Pat is the Archivist for our Society. She was going through some old papers at her grandmother's house, trying to locate some information on the Van Wart family.

She found a 1963 obituary for her grandmother's aunt. It noted that the aunt was survived by Gerow de la Ree, Bergen County sportswriter for the *Bergen Record*. Pat checked the phone book, found his name, and wrote him a letter. Gerow answered right away—he was 65 years old and was interested in the family. Pat sent him charts to fill out. In his attic, he had several pictures that were his mother's. Gerow gave her 50 identified photographs, saying that he had no direct relatives who would be interested in the

material.

One photo was of Isaac Van Wart, her gr (3) grandfather, who died in 1863, age 43. Pat had some of the old photographs blown up to 5 x 7 size, black and white (cost \$5). If you want the negative, the cost is \$15. There was a photo of Gerow's family, one still being alive—Aunt Nellie, age 98.

Isaac's daughter, Jane, died age 40 plus—this obituary Pat found on microfilm. There was also a diary, kept by Gerry's mother and grandmother, in which she found a death date.

Gerry also gave her several autograph books, one dated 1884-85 from Nyack College. These contained many drawings and autographs from people from all over the world. Another was from the Nyack Baptist Sunday School—about 1881-83. In addition to the Van Wart information, Gerry gave her the Storms lineage.

Pat has had several of the photos preserved and noted that she uses Michael's (photographer).

Pat concluded her presentation by stating that it just goes to show you that no clue, no matter how insignificant, should be overlooked.

Ackerman's Corners

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y. Also called Cassady's Corners.

- "Ackerman's Corners"—Green, Frank B., *The History of Rockland County*. New York: A. S. Barnes & Co., 1886, p. 404.

Airmont

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y., near the Mahwah, N.J. border. Also called Masonicus.

- "Airmont"—Howard I. Durie, *The Durie Family*, 1985, p. 168, "...Airmont (formerly Masonicus) area of Suffern, Town of Ramapo in Rockland County, N.Y."

Bardonia

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y.

- 1977, "Bardonia"—in 1977 Hagstrom's Atlas BC & RC.

Bardon's Station

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y. near Nanuet. Named after John Bardon, who settled there about 1850.

- "Bardon's Station"—Cole, History of RC, p. 126.

Bear Mountain

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y.

Beaver Pond

1855 NEW YORK STATE CENSUS, ROCKLAND COUNTY

Transcribed by Pat Wardell

Please see December 1990 issue (p. 6) for general information about this census and about this transcription.

Editor's Note: Due to some sort of a computer glitch (or—could it be?—gasp—a HUMAN error?), my entire transcribed file for these records disappeared from my hard disk (the moral of this story is ALWAYS MAKE A BACKUP!!!). So because I returned the Xeroxed copies of this census months ago, I am back to struggling with reading just the microfilmed version for this transcription. The microfilm makes the enumerator's handwriting just that much more difficult to read (it's hard enough to decipher to begin with). I mention this only as a caveat: from this point on, these transcribed records are almost certain to contain interpretive errors and alas, many bracketed (meaning questionable), question-marked entries, which means they are sometimes just an interpretive guess. Sorry!
