✓ **LDS FHC Research Outline for New York State** — The long-awaited LDS Research Outline for New York State went out to Family History Center Directors in June. ## NOTICES

✓ **Ackerman Reunion** — The annual reunion of the David Ackerman Descendants will be held October 17, 1992 at the Old Stone Church, Upper Saddle River, NJ.

✓ **NJ Vital Statistics Freeze** — Pat Kerner has advised us that her request for a death certificate resulted in a response from the New Jersey Bureau of Vital Statistics that the Bureau has been experiencing an employment freeze and budget restrictions, so all processing of genealogical requests has been suspended indefinitely. The Bureau also advised that the New Jersey State Archives have the original vital records for May 1848 to May 1878. The Archives continues to search these records by mail for a fee of \$4.00 per record. The Archives has also begun to acquire the following vital records on microfilm: marriage records, June 1878 to 1940; death records, June 1878 to 1940; and birth records, June 1878 to 1923. These microfilmed records are open for research at the Archives Tuesday through Friday, 8:30 to 4:30. The Archives, however, cannot search microfilmed records by mail.

✓ **Civil War Soldiers System** — According to an item in the March 1992 *Family Circle* magazine, by 1995, 28 Civil War sites operated by the National Park Service will unveil the Civil War Soldiers System, a computerized directory of the 3.5 million blues and grays who fought in the Civil War. A prototype system is being tested this fall. Volunteers from the Federation of Genealogical Societies are entering into computers the over 3 million names and other information handwritten on millions of index cards by Army clerks during the 1880s. When the project is completed, family historians will be able to locate an ancestor's name and cross-reference it with the 7,000 regiments that participated in 10,500 military engagements, skirmishes and battles.

A small booklet entitled "Looking Back To Sunrise" by Henrietta K. Waxberg, February 1, 1960, was based on her memories and knowledge and the research of her late husband Louis. It contains information on various Dutch families of the following names that settled in the area of Montville, NJ: Van Durne, Van Ness, Van Ripper, Vreeland, Van Worth and Van Orden. It mentions that some descendants of Juriaen Tomassen from De Rype, a small village north of Amsterdam, became Van Rypens and Van Rippers (Ryper) and others went by the name Jurianse, now Yereance. I learned through conversations with others that there are various other spellings, some beginning with A and O, for example.

...Phineas Hedges is one of my grandfathers. He was the father of Melissa Hedges who m. William R. Springsteel.

I have Phineas' original obituary notice and photo copies of a court case that involved his estate. I also have Melissa's family Bible with some family records in the center pages. Phineas' wife was Eliza J. Edwards and I also have her family Bible with family records in it. The Edwards records do not give places of birth, marriage or death, but I would assume it was Rockland County. I have not found any of the family graves in Mount Repose, but they are probably buried somewhere in the county. Most of them died before the state started keeping records so there is no help there. If there is anyone who happens to know where any of the Edwards family is



buried, I would really appreciate having the information.

I'm enclosing records from the family Bibles.

### Preservation and Restoration of Old Photographs

*Program presented by Frank Bulfamante at the April  
28, 1992 meeting of the Genealogical Society of  
Rockland County*

Restoration is most often done when photographs are damaged in some way, such as being cracked or torn, but when details of the facial features are still intact. The restoration is not done on the original photograph, but rather on a copy of the original. A typical restoration takes between 4 to 8 weeks. It can entail airbrushing, pencil and chalk work, and use of oils. The photograph has to dry thoroughly between each step. The restored photographs can have various appearances, according to individual preference. Sepia tones give the restored photo the "antique look." The photograph can be lightly tinted, according to the original detail, or done in heavy oils to bring out additional detail.

The cost of having a photograph restored depends upon the amount of work that has to be done, but generally is between \$80 to \$95 for a black and white 5" x 7" print. The more tinting requested, the more expensive the process. There is an additional charge for each head, so group photos are the most expensive to restore. A negative is made of the restored photograph, and it can therefore be reproduced as many times as needed. The cost of each additional 5" x 7" copy is \$14.95.

Many photographs may appear to be in need of restoration, but need only to be copied and enhanced with various techniques, such as cropping the photograph to delete unwanted damaged areas, or increasing the contrast to bring out details. More than one photograph can be combined to make a composite. Copies can be made from photographs of various sizes and mediums, including tintypes. The cost to have a negative made is \$5. Black and white prints are \$10.50 for 4" x 5"; \$14.95 for 5" x 7"; and \$21.95 for 8" x 10".

In the care and preservation of photographs, scotch tape appears to be the number one enemy. It is best to place torn or deteriorating photographs in a frame with glass. Photographs should not be placed behind plastic because the plastic captures water, which will destroy the photo. Sunlight causes pictures to fade, and humidity causes them to mildew. Any photographs that are displayed in sunlight should be taken out of their frames periodically, and the glass should be thoroughly cleaned and dried. The best way to store photos in an album is the old fashioned way — with corner tabs. Only acid free paper should be used, and a sheet should also be placed between photos to keep them from touching each other. Photographs should be stored in a cool, dark place, not in hot places like the attic or in damp places like the basement. Old negatives also fade and should be stored in the same manner.

For archival quality photo preservation supplies, Mr. Bulfamante recommended obtaining a catalog from Light Impressions, 439 Monroe Avenue, Rochester, NY 14607, telephone 1-800-828-6216.

Photographs last longest if they are black and white. However, some new color processing, if stored

properly, can last 50 to 60 years without fading. Any color photo exposed to light will fade. Black and white film must be printed on black and white paper, or it will fade as rapidly as a color photo. It is interesting to note that black and white photos become sepia toned when the silver in the paper is not properly removed during processing, and the silver tarnishes with age.

Mr. Bulfamante answered questions about personal photographs brought in by those attending the meeting, and made recommendations as to whether or not they needed restoration.

### Dutch Factory, the

Area named for a cotton factory built about 1812 near the western boundary of Clarkstown in Rockland County, N.Y.
