The Rose Family

*Program presented by Reuben and Mary Kate
(Green) Brown at the October 27, 1992 meeting of the
Genealogical Society of Rockland County*

Mary Kate and Reuben have found Rose ancestors as far back as 1750. They started out at Mount Rest Cemetery, adjacent to the First Methodist Church of Stony Point, looking at tombstones of nonfamily members. The objective was to trace their son and Mary Kate's sister's son back as far as possible.

Emaline Green was buried in Mt. Rest; her husband was Joseph W. Green, whom they have had trouble tracing. They talked with Emeline's mother, checked resources in Rockland County, and the Family History Center five blocks from their home in New York City. The Family History Center has the census of the entire country on microfilm. The New York Public Library is another wonderful source — it has a terrific genealogy and family history room. The Budke collection is intact there. The library also has a rare book collection and some legal collections, as well as map rooms.

While looking at the census records, one can see the route the census takers took. One can use the 1855 New York State census in conjunction with the 1854 map. From 1850 onward, the houses and the families were numbered. The State Library in Albany has many DAR records. However, there is a redundancy regarding the Roses — typing errors, errors in transcription of the U.S. census. As an example, in 1830, the Roses lived in Haverstraw in "Putnam County"! Of course, this should be Rockland County, where most of the Roses lived in Stony Point.

Emeline Rose Green was born between 1837-39 and died in 1901. The 1850 census listed her as 13 years old in the household of Jacob Rose (d. 1859) and his wife Eliza Welch (married 1832). Eliza's parents were probably John Welch and Mary (). Eliza was probably Jacob's third wife. Jacob's father was also Jacob (b. 1745; d. 1804). He left seven sons (no daughters listed).

At this point, Mr. Brown passed out a computerized handout which included:

In the 1790 Clinton Survey, Jacob Rose's (d.1804) land appeared to be near Tomkins Cove. In 1795, he bought land in Lot #15 of the Cheesecocks Patent. According to Cole, he lived in the oldest house in Stony Point.

It is difficult to tell the difference between the Dutch and the English Roses. There were Germans that came in 1708-10 up the Hudson River. Many of these migrated from Newburgh up to Schoharie County.

Some Roses were baptized at the Ramapo Lutheran Church about 1775. There was a Jacob Rose listed here. Could this possibly be the old Jacob? Henry Rose (Jacob's son) married "Polly;" later it is recorded as being married to "Mary." Are they one and the same? There were Roses in the Kakiat Patent in 1716. There are 25 handwritten pages of Roosas in the Kingston are (NY State Library). Another question is did the Roses come up the river or down the river? Perhaps they may have come down from Newburgh. The first Dutch Roos who was born in Bergen County came from a family that originated from Amsterdam. Another Rose — Jonathan — came from Long Island. ■

An undated newspaper clipping (photo) about a Rose Golden Wedding Anniversary came from Helen Nuessle; Marie Koestler has Xeroxes of it which she will give to anyone who wants a copy. The clipping concerns the Golden Wedding Anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred J. Rose of Main Street, Stony Point. Someone has handwritten on the clipping: Mar 25th 1906 — Mar 26, 1956.

Genealogical Information Extracted from Widow's Dower Book No. 1

contributed by Sally Dewey

This book is on the shelves at the Rockland County Surrogate's Court. Most of the petitions recorded in this book seem to be concerned with the administration of the dower, contentions regarding the dower, and admeasurements of the dower.

4/12/1834

Jane Conklin, widow of Henry H. Conklin, is the

wife of Jesse Conklin of the Town of Ramapo. She was married to Henry until his death 2/5/1833. Eliza Conklin, thru her guardian Jacob Straut, claims to be among the owners of land as heir at law of Henry H. Conklin.

10/13/1837

Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Straut, was the widow of Samuel DeRonde. He died 3/1834. Mentioned are: Martha DeRonde the elder, of the City of NY, Martha Ann DeRonde, and Margaret DeRonde, all of the same place. Margaret is about twenty years old.

4/18/1838

Wm. McDougall and Catherine his wife are of the town of Patterson, Passaic County, NJ. She was the wife of Benjamin Sherwood of Ramapo, who died 5/17/1820. Widow remarried about 10/1828.

11/24/1841

Bridget Appleby is the widow of Elanathan Appleby of Clarkstown.

8/20/1845

Rachel Rose, widow of Peter Rose who died 6/18/1844 of Ramapo. Had been married in Ulster County. Heirs: Ellen Rose, wife of Daniel Brundieg of Ramapo; Aaron Rose, of New Jersey; Henry D. Rose, of New Jersey; Jacob W. Rose of Ramapo; Margaret Rose, wife of Jacob Valentine, of Ramapo; Sarah Rose of Ramapo; Catherine Perot (?) of Brooklyn; and Catherine Demarest, wife of James Demarest, of New York City.

11/13/1845

Rachel Gravenstine widow of Benjamin Gravenstine of Orangetown.

1/6/1846

James Bly of City of New York and Martha, his wife; her late husband was Abraham A. Sarvent of Clarkstown.

12/23/1845

Elizabeth T. Felter of Clarkstown is the guardian of David Felter, a minor. Abigale Felter is the widow of David Felter. Edward Felter died by 12/23/1845. Elizabeth Teresa Felter mentioned.

6/11/1849

Jacob Knapp and Rachel, his wife, of Clarkstown, who was the widow of Abraham Youmans who died 5/9/1829. Rachel is the mother of John A. Youmans. Mary Youmans mentioned.

9/9/1853

Marjory Laurence of Ramapo is the widow of Samuel Laurence. They married 10/14/1852 and he died 5/23/1853. Rachel, wife of John (L. or T.) Cooper and Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Eckerson, all of

Ramapo, are only heirs at law of Samuel Laurence.

3/29/1854

Hannah Cornelison, widow of Nathaniel Cornelison, of Orangetown. Out of whose lands the dower has been admeasured: Jane Bell and William Bell, Catherine Provost and Peter Peter Provost, and Michael Cornelison. ■

Greenbush

Area that is part of present Blauvelt and Orangeburg, in Rockland County, N.Y. Earlier called Clausland.

Gurnee's Corners
