✓ **Using Land Records to Trace Ancestors** — William Dollarhide, writing in an article in the Jan-Feb 1995 *Genealogy Bulletin* of the American Genealogical Lending Library claims that 90% of the adult male population owned land before 1850, so the odds are good that you'll find your ancestor in county-recorded deeds and land grant records. There are surname indexes to these records. An added bonus is that land records often reveal the name of a man's wife.

If you find place names in deeds, records, and other documents, I would like to know so that I can add time frames, geographic place-

Table Rock

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y., near Sloatsburg.

- 1977, "Table Rock"—in 1977 Hagstrom's Atlas of Bergen & Rockland Counties.

Tallman

A community in Rockland County, N.Y. Earlier known as Tallman's. Named for Teunis I. Tallman, who settled here in 1836 and kept a store and tavern.

- 1977, "Tallman"—in 1977 Hagstrom's Atlas of Bergen and Rockland Counties.

Tappan

Early settlement in Orange County (later Rockland County), N.Y.; one of the first New York communities on the west side of the Hudson river. Originally an unspecified area within the jurisdiction of the Tappan Reformed Dutch Church, established here in 1694. Sometimes called Orangetown, it was the county seat of Orange County at the time of the Revolution.

Tappan Slote

Now the Piermont-Sparkill area, in Rockland County, N.Y.

Taulman's Landing

An early name for what became Piermont, in Rockland County, N.Y. Named for Abraham Taulman, who kept a store here (succeeding Abraham Mabie) from about 1783.

Tedious Hook

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y. Also Verdrietig Hook, which name is from the Dutch, meaning sorrowful (or tedious) point of land. Also a stream by this name.

Thiells

A community in Rockland County, N.Y., northwest of Haverstraw. It takes its name from an early settler of the area, a Dane named Jacob Thiell, who ran a forge and grist mill here. Also Thiell's Corners.

Tomkins Cove

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y., north of Stony Point.

Torne

A locality in what is now Harriman State Park in Rockland County, N.Y. The name is derived from the Dutch word for Steeple.

Turkey Ridge

A locality on the New Jersey-New York border, near Palisades, N.Y.

A locality in Orange County, N.Y.

Tuxedo Park

A locality in Orange County, N.Y.

Union Hill

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y., in or near Suffern.

A locality in Rockland County, N.Y., northwest of Nyack.

Van Duser's Pond

Also Nigger Pond and Negro Pond. Earlier known by the Indians as Pothat or Potake. A small lake near Sloatsburg, in Rockland County, N.Y. A survey of the area made in 1774 mentions "...negro Guy's improvement..." and tradition has it that an early landowner, Mr. Rutherford, allowed black settlers to make their homes here.

ANCESTOR TABLES

In order to increase interaction between members, the Society has begun to publish Ancestor Tables, which are a brief listing of the ancestry of members. These tables will be printed in expanded editions of the newsletter for a year, after which the Board will evaluate the response and decide whether to continue publishing these tables. It is hoped that members will find distant cousins who share common lines, which will further the research efforts of both.

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for publication.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the ANCESTOR TABLE FORUM.
