✓ **Capital Dist. Gen. Soc. 15th Annual Conference** — The Capital District Genealogical Society's 15th annual conference will be held April 12, 1997, at Albany, NY at the Holiday Inn, Wolf Road, Albany, NY, from 9 am to 4 pm. The cost will be \$25.00, which includes morning coffee with pastries, and lunch. Roger Joslyn, a noted speaker and writer on New York and New Jersey research, will discuss three subjects: "Born in New York, but where in New York?" ✓ **Cayuga County Research** — Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot wrote: Numerous land bonus grants in the area were made to soldiers who served in the American Revolution. Many Rockland families have branches there. Research by mail by the County Historian's Office may take as long as six months to a year. Research estimated at over one hour and return of research has a minimum cost of \$30. Over three hours is billed at \$10 per hour, plus postage. Payment, in advance, must be by money order or bank draft. No personal checks are accepted. The fee includes up to 10 copies of their records. Copies of land records can be obtained only from the Records Retention Office in Auburn at 50¢ per page. For further information write Thomas G. ✓ **Old Calvary Cemetery (Woodside, NY)** — Rosemary Muscarella Ardolina has compiled Old Calvary Cemetery: New Yorkers Carved in Stone, which has been published by Heritage Books, Inc. for \$76 plus \$4 shipping and handling. Old Calvary Cemetery covers 365 acres of the area called Blissville (now Woodside). The book includes burials from 1848 to the mid 1900s — 5315 transcriptions of headstones, a brief history of the cemetery, a map, photos, and an everynames index. 549 pp, 8.5 x 11, paperback. Is he the son of Abraham Post and Jannetje Jersey? (Abraham died ca 1837 - was of West Milford, NJ at time of will.) Passaic County Deeds, Book F, pgs. 302-310 have brothers Abraham A. Post, Jacob A. Post, Peter A. Post and John A. Post "exchanging" deeds in 1842. (sons of Abraham Post Sr.) John A. Post is only son in Franklin Twp., Bergen Co., NJ. His brothers are all in West Milford, NJ. (in these deeds). The John A. in question married Hannah (Annatie) Ackerman, 31 Oct. 1807, Kakiat Dutch Reformed Church, Rockland Co., NY, dau of John A. Ackerman and Elizabeth Dierman, bapt. 16 Nov. 1788, Paramus DRC, NJ. (Her age at death calculates to birthdate of ca. 1785.) Hannah died 28 Nov. 1845 and is also buried Union Cemetery, Ramsey, NJ. The will of John A. Post names children John, Peter, Jacob, Jane and Elizabeth (dec'd.) The will of John A. Post's mother-in-law, Elizabeth (Dierman) Ackerman mentions her granddaughter, Jane, daughter of her deceased daughter Hannah, and names Jane's husband as Henry B. Winter.

The State Library allows anyone to borrow newspapers on microfilm (except for the New York Times) via interlibrary loan at your local public, school, or college library. The State Library ships up to 5 reels per request anywhere in the world.

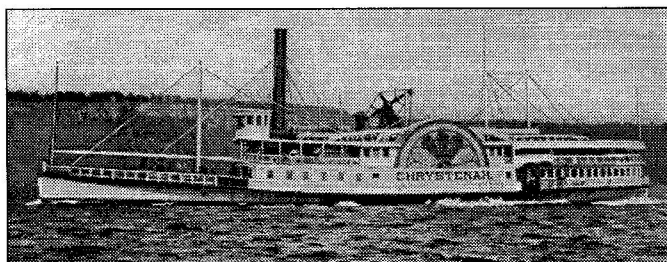

■ **"Uniquely New York,"** an exhibit of photographs, documents, and maps from the New York State Archives, is now appearing on the world-wide web at:

<http://www.sara.nysed.gov>

The exhibit spans more than 300 years of New York history gives a glimpse of the kinds of records that are collected by the State Archives in Albany. These images of archival records are organized into five broad themes: New York's People, Land, Culture, Government, and Economy. The section on People includes a 1732 land deed with colonial wax seals and Indian pictographs as well as poet Joyce Kilmer's World War I military service records. The 1664 royal charter that gave James, the Duke of York territory that included present day New York, New Jersey, most of Maine, and part of Connecticut and Pennsylvania can be viewed in the section on Land. Actual archival records collected by the New York State government are located in the Cultural Education Center in Albany. Its research room is open Monday – Friday, 9-5. ■

Resumes of Past Programs at Meetings of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County

Slide Presentation of the Nyacks

Program presented by Bob Goldberg of Friends of the Nyacks, at the June 25, 1996 meeting of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County. Notes by Joan Brooks, Recording Secretary.

Bob presented a slide show of the Nyacks, many of which were taken from Ken Kral's postcard collection. They show how we have been able to illustrate the history of Nyack. It began as a frontier settlement, then went through the gilded age, and in the early 1900s, everything virtually stopped. The Friends of the Nyacks sponsors tours of different areas of the Nyacks, including Oak Hill Cemetery. They average one a month. The Friends celebrate the local history of Nyack. Bob stated that "all history is local history." History is played out on the streets of Nyack. Carl Nordstrom wrote a basic history of Nyack. Included among the slides shown were the following views:

- Plaque — First Settlement (1675), Midland Bank. Claes Jansen van Purmerant (Cuyper, Cooper) owned the land, but never actually settled on it.
- Corneius Claessen Cuyper (son) settled the lands below Hook Mountain — Plat map (Upper Nyack).
- John Claessen Cuyper (brother) was given land at Salisbury Point; the house is now demolished; had been called Cornelison or Salisbury House.
- Sarvent House, still standing — refurbished.
- Map of farms in Revolutionary times.
- Painting of naval battle on the Tappan Zee.
- Salisbury House British used it as headquarters.
- Quarry along Hudson River (Rockland Lake).
- Hook Mountain — completely "bald" from quarrying.
- Lydecker House.
- Old Stone House, c. 1810. Brothers Tunis and Peter Smith from Blauvelt were the first real estate developers in Nyack. They divided land into lots for residential and commercial use.
- Ramapo in Ye Olden Times — Suffern and New Antrim started to develop; people needed to get to the Hudson River, so they built the Nyack Turnpike (Route 59), which was completed in the 1830s and began as a toll road.
- Boatyard; boatbuilding. Steamboat ticket. Steamboat "Chrystenah." Building a catamaran in 1860. Ship building Table for Hudson River ports.

- Peterson's Boat Yard, World War I. Subchasers were built there. Between the wars, they built luxury yachts; in World War II, PT boats.
- Rockland Female Institute — 1856 — South Nyack; later Prospect House Hotel.
- Building that eventually became the Tappan Zee Inn or Hotel and the Hudson River Military Academy.
- St. George Hotel on Burd Street (still standing).
- St. Nicholas Hotel, Broadway (no longer extant). It was built in 1867; Joseph Demarest was the proprietor, The frame was put up in one day.
- Union Hall (now Turriello's Pizza). Civil War troops were trained here.
- Broadway (now Tappan Zee Play House); was Wigwam. Horace Greeley spoke to 1,500 people here.
- Perry Shoe Factory in 1820-30. This was a major stop on the underground railroad.
- Havermale's (formerly was a shoe factory building).
- Organ factory; one organ built here is still in the Baptist Church.
- 1 Piermont Avenue (1830; still standing). Last

known as the vanilla factory, built by Azariah Ross.

- An 1850 view of the Nyack Dutch Reformed Church; dirt streets, wooden sidewalks.

- Clarkstown Country Club, organized by Dr. Pierre Bernard. ■

ANCESTOR TABLES

In order to increase interaction between members, the Society has begun to publish Ancestor Tables, which are a brief listing of the ancestry of members. These tables will be printed in expanded editions of the newsletter for a year, after which the Board will evaluate the response and decide whether to continue publishing these tables. It is hoped that members will find distant cousins who share common lines, which will further the research efforts of both.

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for publication.

Please note: the Genealogical Society of Rockland County and its editor are not responsible for the accuracy of the Ancestor Tables.

We remind our contributors that they should be submitting only documented ancestors. Please do not submit names that are not well documented. If there is any uncertainty, then the listing should be preceded by a "?".

Anyone interested in a particular ancestor or ancestral line should contact the submitter for details and documentation.

Anyone who has contradictory data or corrections should send a note to the Newsletter editor, or to Bob Protzmann at the address above, as well as directly to the submitter.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the ANCESTOR TABLE FORUM.

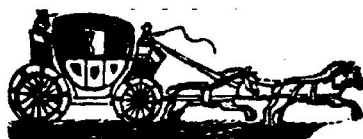
