✓ **Reprint of NYC Ref Marriage Records** — Heritage Books, Inc., 1540E Pointer Ridge Place, Bowie, MD 20716 (1-800-398-7709) has reprinted in a paperback edition Records of the Reformed Dutch Church in New Amsterdam and New York, Marriages from 11 December 1639 to 26 August 1801 (Marriages in the Dutch Church, New York), by Samuel S. Purple (originally copyrighted 1890 by The New York Genealogical & Biographical Society).

✓ **Orphan's Court Records** — Orphan's Court records are filed in county courthouses. Children listed in Orphan's Court records have lost their father; there is no age designation, and in many cases the mother was still living. The records show the administration of estates, sometimes the appointed trustees or guardians for minor or incompetent children. The records contain names, births, death dates, marriages, and sometimes the maiden name of the mother. If a guardian is required, the mother of the family often requested that her father or brother be asked. — from *Family Tree*, Odom Library, Moultrie, GA (Dec 1997/Jan 1998 issue).

✓ **Place Names** — "How did that place get its name?" an article by Randi Weiner, in the *Journal News* issue of 20 January 1998, concerned place names in Rockland County — including streets, communities, waterways, ridges, rocks and neighborhoods. Mentioned are Hessian Lake, Anthony's Nose, Smith Road in Nanuet, High Tor, Benson's Corners, and others.

✓ **Tappan Ref Ch Baptisms In Print** — Baptism Records of the Tappan Reformed Church, Tappan, Rockland County, NY 1694-1899 have been compiled by Arthur C. M. Kelly (copied from original church books; each baptism has been given an item number, indexes of parents and sponsors refer to the item number). 148. REYNOLDS/RUNNELS, WOODARD/WOODWARD — Searching for the parents of my 4th great grandfather, Samuel Reynolds. He was born May 14, 1764 in Hempstead, Orange Co., NY. According to "The Marriage Records of the Reformed Dutch Churches of Tappan & Clarkstown, Rockland Co., NY (1694-1831), Samuel R. Runnels (Reynolds) married Sarah Woodard (Woodward) on Dec. 26, 1786. Both were from Kakiat. He served in the Revolutionary War during 1780-82. He removed to the township of Bernards, county of Somerset, NJ in 1791. In the

"Proceedings New Jersey Historical Society", it says he "volunteered in 1780 in Capt. Aiken's Co., Col. Cooper's Regiment, for express purpose of allowing his father to remain home, he being upwards of 80, and, though not compelled to do militia duty, he would go to defend his country." ■

ANSWERS TO QUERIES

Answer to Query 120 (Dec 1996 Newsletter) from Richard S. Peterson, 290 S. Middletown Rd., Pearl River, NY 10965 —

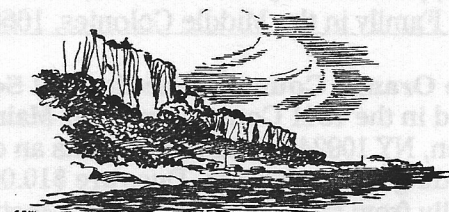
Jacob Jones was born about 17 May 1778, and died at Camp Hill, Ramapo, 5 Dec 1851, aged 73 years, 7 months, 18 days. He married Amelia Cunningham, born circa 20 May 1779, died 27 Feb 1854, aged 75 years, 9 months, 7 days. Jacob and Amelia are buried at the Jones family plot, Camp Hill, Pomona (*Tombstone Inscriptions, Bergen & Rockland Counties: Budke*). Budke says that Jacob came to Rockland from the area of Sugar Loaf in Orange County, and went first to a place near the distillery about a mile south of the English Church, and after a year moved to his farm at Camphill in 1814.

Jacob was the son of Jacob Jones and Hannah Jones. (*See will # F-304*). Jacob Jones Sr. was born 18 February 1759, probably at Ramapo (Kakiat) and died 4 May 1839 in Orange County, NY. He married his cousin, Hannah Jones, on 2 Feb 1776 at the house of her parents, John Jones and -?- Smith. Hannah Jones was born 13 February 1759, and died September 1842, at which time she was living in Monroe, Orange County. (*See Revolutionary War Pension Applications for Jacob Jones, and for Hannah Jones, widow.*)

Jacob Jones Sr. was the son of Joseph & Charity Jones of Clarkstown, of which nothing is presently known. Such is the case also with John Jones and -?- Smith.

If anyone has information that contradicts or complements this query answer, please let me know

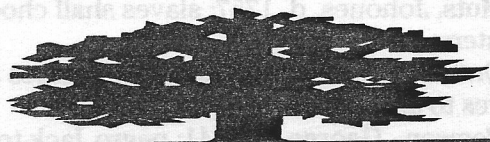

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for publication.

Please note: the Genealogical Society of Rockland County and its editor are not responsible for the accuracy of the Ancestor Tables.

We remind our contributors that they should be submitting only documented ancestors. Please do not submit names that are not well documented. If there is any uncertainty, then the listing should be preceded by a "?".

Anyone interested in a particular ancestor or ancestral line should contact the submitter for details and documentation.

Anyone who has contradictory data or corrections should send a note to the Newsletter editor, or to Bob Protzmann at the address above, as well as directly to the submitter.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the ANCESTOR TABLE FORUM.
