Benjamin Jones & wife Rachel moved to Onandaga Co., NY in 1830s. There in census of 1840 & 1850. Benjamin & Rachel had 8 children:
Brewster, b. 2 Jan 1797; Ann, b.24 Aug 1799;
Jacob, b. 24 Jul 1801; John, b. 1 Dec 1803; Daniel,
b. 13 Jan 1806; Rachel, b. 22 Oct 1807; Catherine,
b. 23 Sep 1810; Sarah, b. 24 Dec 1814. When
Benjamin died in 1850 his children were living as
follows: Brewster at Haverstraw, Ann Jones King
at Ogden, Monroe Co, NY, Jacob at Ramapo,
Daniel at VanBuren, Onandaga Co, Rachel Jones
Washburn at Sing Sing, Westchester Co, NY,
Catherine Jones Jones at VanBuren, Onandaga Co,
NY, Sarah Jones Wright at Sing Sing, Westchester
Co, NY. The 4th child, John Jones, was not
mentioned in Benjamins will, and is presumed to
have died before his father. Benjamin Jones died 7
Oct 1850 and Rachel died 11 Mar 1858, both in
the town of VanBuren, Onandaga Co, NY.
Benjamin Jones was the son of John Jones, born
c/1740, reportedly in Wales. John was married to
Sally ____ ? and lived at Haverstraw NY. The nine
children of John Jones and Sally were: Benjamin J.,
b. 15 Jul 1769; Charity, b. 1771; William J. b.1774;
Daniel J., dob unknown; Nathaniel, dob unknown;
Betsy, b. c/1776; Hannah, b.c/1778; Mary, dob
unknown; Sarah, dob unknown.

regretted. He was a native of England.

Nov. 11th, 1847

Married- on the 6th inst. by the Rev. G. Vanhorne, Mr.
Thomas Philips to Miss. Catherine McKenzie, both of
N. Haverstraw.

Died- on the 15th inst. Rachel Hawkins, wife of Jonas
Hawkins of Montgomery, aged 36.

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PAST PROGRAMS

In keeping with the 1998 Rockland County Bi-Centennial celebration, the following three programs were presented to the membership.

Miniature village of Congers, Mar. 24th, 1998

Mr. John Rossi, builder of miniature houses, spoke about the hamlet of Congers. In 1976 he had his Scout troop prepare family trees, and he himself then became interested in family history. John uses his woodworking skills to build miniature replicas of historic local buildings. Word spread and people began asking him to recreate their homes.

Congers was originally called Cedar Grove Corners. The Boston Improvement Co. brought workers up from N.Y.C. and the Railroad Station, Post Office, and Rockland County's first A&P Store were soon built. Hotels and churches followed. Many of the workers stayed, and worked in local hotels, stone quarries and ice houses.

Among the many miniatures John brought for "Show and Tell" were the Railroad Station, A&P Building, Berghols Hotel, churches, schools, and other hotels, as well as private homes. John also brought replicas of some Valley Cottage buildings, including the Post Office, Green Hotel, Fire House, Bregas Livery, Etc.

John works to scale using old photographs, many from a 1983 book published by the Congers Civic Assoc. His attention to detail, and the many hours of work taken to produce his miniatures is apparent when the finished product is seen. Close inspection and handling of the replicas followed the program.

Haverstraw Brick Museum. April 28, 1998

Patricia Gordon, President of the Haverstraw Brick Museum, was born in Haverstraw, and has always been involved in local activities. As a member of the Chamber of Commerce, she repeatedly pushed for the creation of a Brick Museum, and after six years it has become a reality. Postcards were

mailed announcing the first meeting, and surprisingly 27 people attended. The idea was approached enthusiastically, and all 27 board members played a vital role in getting the museum project off the ground.

To raise funds, the Lucas Candy Store in Haverstraw has held a raffle each year. The first Brick Museum exhibit was in the Lucas Candy Store, and was attended by over 400 people. A board of Directors, a Logo, and a State Charter soon followed. Brochures, slides and videos are planned to take the story to the public.

The Village of Haverstraw has promised them a building, and they hope to construct a museum next to Vincent's Landing. Their goals are to exhibit brick making in miniature, as well as a model of the 1906 landslide. Also planned is a model brick making machine for hands-on participation by children. Long term goals are a group of museum buildings with a mechanical brickyard and other exhibits, and a working replica of the Hudson River Steamships.

Pat revealed that the most important problem facing the museum is money. Mrs. Daniel DeNoyelles has arranged for the museum to copyright her husbands book about the brick making industry. A lively discussion followed Pat's presentation.

Rockland Lake, June 23, 1998

Mr. Rudy Hazuka, a lifelong resident and 58 year member of the Fire Department, spoke of his love for the hamlet of Rockland Lake. He has traveled the world over, but always came back to his boyhood home.

Spring fed Rockland Lake was originally called Quaspeck Pond, and in places was up to 93 feet deep. Years ago there were two beautiful beaches called Quaspeck Park and Quaspeck Park East. On the hill near the Fire House is an old cemetery dating back to the 1700's, where some of the old residents are buried, including many members of the Wells family.

The ice business in Rockland Lake was started around 1831 with several small companies. In 1855 the Knickerbocker Ice Co. came in and the business boomed. Ice was supplied to the Astor House in New York City, and the name was changed from Quaspeck Pond to Rockland Lake. The ice company had hundreds of horses used to move the large blocks of ice, and there were many spring fed watering troughs along the road, some of which can still be seen. Later steam engines were used to move the 300 lb. blocks of ice over the hill and down to the river landing. Local trucks loaded up to deliver ice to Rockland County customers.

In 1926 there was a big ice house fire, and thirteen houses burned as well. Burned out families were taken in by their more fortunate neighbors. Everyone took care of each other like a large extended family.

Local people worked in the ice houses in the winter, and in stone quarries during the summer. There were many boarding houses in Rockland Lake, as well as houses built by the Knickerbocker Ice Co. for their employees. Rudy's sister taught in the Rockland Lake School until it closed. There were up to 48 students, and three teachers. There was a Catholic church and a Methodist church, and the Red Mens Hall, near the firehouse. Silent movies were shown in the hall, and once a month a dance band came in. Every house had a well with a bucket and rope. Milk and butter were lowered into the well to keep them cool. Everyone had chickens and pigs, and no fences. Sleigh riding and barrel stave skiing were winter pastimes for the youngsters. Rudys father used to repair their shoes with used tire treads, which gave good traction in the snow.

Rockland Lake had five farms, among them Emmett Farm, Zenobio Farm, Bannis Farm and Hessek Farm. After the Knickerbocker Ice Co. left, the Hicks family cut ice for awhile. After that mushrooms were raised in the cool dark ice houses. The hamlets barber was a fisherman, and those wanting a haircut had to ring a bell and wait for

him to come up from the lake. After doing business he would return to his fishing,

In 1929 and 1930, the W.P.A. built two parks by the river, North Park and South Park. About 4000 employees were involved in the project. W.P.A. and C.C.C. workers were paid \$30.00 per month. They did a lot of work with the parks, constructing all the stone buildings. The South Park had some amusements, and the North Park a dance hall with big name bands.

A railroad spur was built from Congers to where the fishing station is now. There was a horse and buggy service to the railroad behind Red Men's Hall. The West Shore RR brought people up in the morning and picked them up at 3:30. Boats would also come up and drop off people. There would be about 25,000 people in Rockland Lake on week-ends. During the war everything was neglected, things started falling apart, and population declined. The Post Office served the hamlet from 1842 until 1965. The last post mistress was Florence Brinkerhoff, and the post office was located in her home.

Rudy brought copies of old photographs from Rockland lake village, and passed them around. Everyone enjoyed Rudy and his memories, and Rudy enjoyed talking about his beautiful Rockland Lake home.

The numbering system used is as follows. The submitter is number 1. The fathers number is twice the number of the child, i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one more than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male, odd numbers always female (except for #1, which is always the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestors Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual persons number in that ancestor table to Bob Protzmann at the address above.
