The Rockland Room is going electronic! During the next few months, the room will be wired for Internet service, and we'll be getting equipment and some special genealogical CD-ROM's. It should be an exciting time for researchers.

There is a newly formed organization in the county called the Rockland County Historical Consortium. Comprised of county museums, historical groups and government agencies, this group hopes to educate and inform people of the wonders of the history of the county. The Rockland Room and the New City Library played an important part in getting the group started.

Saturday, April 24, 1:30 PM

Nancy J. Doane, Director, will talk about her unusual library, The Godfrey Memorial Library, in Middletown, Connecticut. It is a public library which specializes in American biography, American Genealogy and American local history. Early New England genealogists will want to attend.

Saturday, May 8, 1:30 PM

Huguenot researchers mark this date! Professor Emeritus, Dr. Alfred H. Marks, village and town historian of New Paltz will lecture on the early Huguenot settlement in New Paltz.

ROCKLAND COUNTY MESSENGER

A weekly newspaper published at Haverstraw, NY

A microfilm available at the New City Public Library contains many copies of this old newspaper. All issues were not available at filming, some that were had been snipped, and others were in poor condition. Notices of marriage & death were copied as they were found.

The microfilm begins with the Thursday, July 29th, 1847 issue.

Jan 16th, 1851

Married- on the 5th inst. by the Rev. S.D. Lougheed, Mr. Anthony Bessey to Miss. Angeline Hammond of Haverstraw.

Married- on the 29th inst. by the Rev. S.D. Lougheed, Mr. Andrew Abrams to Miss. Frances Weaver, all of Rockland County.

Jan 23rd, 1851

Married- At Haverstraw on Wednesday evening January 15th by the A.S. Freeman, Robert Buchanan of Newburgh to Nancy E., daughter of Mr. Amos Briggs, of the former place.

Married- on the 16th inst. by the Rev. John S. Swain, Mr. Abraham Perry to Miss. Laura Decker, both of the Village of Nyack.

Feb 13th 1851

Married- on Thursday January 30th. by the Rev. John Manley, Mr. John Vanderbilt of Nyack to Miss. Eliza Wanamaker of Ramapo.

Died- in the city of New York on the 24th of January, Mrs. Antionette Hopper, aged 43 years.

Died- At Tappan January 30th, Elizabeth, widow of James Kirkpatrick, in the 67th year of her age.

March 6, 1851

Married- On Monday evening, the 24th inst. by the Rev. Charles Hageman, Mr. William W. Searby to Miss. Jerushah Ann Steele, both of Nyack.

Died- In Oswego on the 22nd of February, Mr. John Peck, aged 72, father of John J. Peck of Haverstraw.

March 13th, 1851

Married- On the 3rd. inst. by the Rev. S.D. Lougheed, Mr. George Smith to Miss. Sarah Mallinson, all of Spring Valley.

Died- In Bergen County, NJ on the 8th of March, Mrs. Elizabeth, wife of James Babcook, formerly of Haverstraw, aged 59 years.

BERGEN PENSION ABSTRACTS

Genealogical Abstracts of Revolutionary War Pension Applications relating to Bergen Co. NJ and Rockland Co. NY. *Contributed by Philip O'Leary.*

HARMEN BLAUVELT. Pvt, NJ Militia, Revolutionary War Pension #:S959, Bergen County, NJ Common Pleas Court, 31 October 1832.

Harmen Blauvelt, age 71, resident of Harrington Twp. Bergen Co. NJ, brother of Abraham Blauvelt, nephew of Frederick Blauvelt.

I (Harmen Blauvelt) know the following Revolutionary War soldiers: Cornelius Quackenbush, Garret F., John F. Haring, Albert Peterson, Abraham Flerobean, Harman Pierson, who was wounded, John Kearns, Sgt., William Turner, Sgt., John Ferae Gibson, George Griffin, Thomas Hamilton, Joseph Babcock, John Paterson.

JOHN HOUSE. Pvt, NY Militia, Revolutionary War Pension # W1182. Rockland Co. NY Common Pleas Court, 13 November, 1832.

John House, age 73, resident of Clarkstown, Rockland Co. NY. born 14 Jun 1759 Clarkstown, record at Clarkstown RDC.

Started service in Continental Troops under Col. Peter Fell. Served in NY Militia under Captains Jacob Deronder, Hendrick Tenure, John Gardner, John Bell. Other officers were Colonels Ann Hawkes Hay, Gilbert Cooper, and Col Graham, Lieutenants Isaac Coe, John D. Coe (crossed out) 1st. Lts. Tunis Tallman, Hout Van Orden, 2nd. Lt. Thomas Blauvelt.

I (John House) served as a substitute for my father (no name given) and brother, Rynard House. Served as a guard and scout in Bergen County, NJ.

Rockland Co., NY, Common Pleas Court, 3 May 1853 Margaret House, age 88, resident of Clarkstown, widow of John House, who died 1 Jan 1845 Clarkstown. Married 26 May 1832, NYC, RDC by Rev. Marselus.

Others mentioned in pension (no relationship stated): Peter D.W. Smith, Cornelius J. Blauvelt, Peter Stevens, 09 Jun 1853 Margaret VerValen of Clarkstown, John Blauvelt, of Rockland Co., NY. 03 May 1853 John VerValen, of Rockland Co., NY, John J. House, present at marriage. Rev. Alexander H. Warner, Jacob D. Clark.

12 Jul 1853. A certificate from Archibald Campbell, Deputy Secretary of NY State, certifying that a John House (not sure if same John House) served in Col. Goose VanSchiacks 1st NY Regiment, and received a bounty land reward of 600 acres on 07 Jul 1790.

Testifying as fellow soldiers in the Revolutionary War.

17 Oct 1832: Garret Smith of Pompton, Rynard Hopper of Franklin Township, both of Bergen Co., NJ.

7 Dec 1833 Tunis Tallman, age 85, of Clarkstown, John J. Blauvelt, age 82, of Clarkstown, John Hutton, age 73, Garret Sarven, age 77, Claus Van Houten, age 87, Peter Stevens, age 72, all of Rockland Co., NY

RINARD HOPPER. Pvt. NJ & NY Militia, Revolutionary War Pension #S1022. Bergen Co., NY Common Pleas Court, 31 Oct 1832

Rynard Hopper, age 78, of Franklin Township, Bergen Co., NJ. b/ 23 Mar 1754 at a place now called Callea (?), Rockland Co., NY. Record at the Clarkstown RDC

Living at Clarkstown, Rockland Co., NY when called to service. Was at Bunker's Hill on York Island and Kings Ferry; marched from Tellors Point to Red Hill, near Rukskill, to build fortifications, also an express rider. I served under Lt. Hay of the Continental Line, Lts. John D. Vanderbilt and Isaac Coe, 1st. Lt. Hout VanOrden and Tunis Tallman, 2nd Lts. Thomas Blauvelt and Resolvert Van Houten.

John Taylor was severely wounded by the British Refugees at Closter, Bergen Co., NJ.

I know the following men who can testify s to my war service: James Turner/Tenure/Tourner ?, Nicholas VanHouten, and Peter VanOrden.

ALEXANDER LIBRARY
at Rutgers University

Last September I visited the Alexander Library, of Rutgers University, the State University of New Jersey. The library contains the genealogy and local history collections and the archives of the university in the downstairs Special Collections and University Archives area.

It was a 55 mile trip from NYC, taking a little over an hour. The best route is via the Garden State Parkway to the New Jersey Turnpike. Take the turnpike south to exit #10, New Brunswick. Go north on Rt 18 into New Brunswick. There is essentially no parking within the university. The best place to park is the municipal garage, adjacent to the RR station. It is a 15 minute walk north on College Ave to the library. Alternatively, university buses can be taken along College Ave.

The library is open to the general public. It is the home of the collection of the Genealogical Society of New Jersey, as well as the University collections. Records of 800 cemeteries and 16 card file drawers of tombstone inscriptions are available. Bible records and Family Collections are extensive.

Other holdings include: Published Genealogies, Church and Synagogue Records (on microfilm), Biographical files on faculty and trustees of Rutgers University, NJ Census Records, County and Local Histories, NJ City Directories, paper and microfilm. The collection concentrates on New Jersey families and records, but does contain additional information, especially for adjoining regions- New York, Pennsylvania and new England. The electronic card catalog, employing IRIS, can be searched on-site, or on-line over the Web. The staff was extremely friendly and helpful.

STAMFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Ferguson Library, on Broad Street, Stamford, CT, is the main branch of the Stamford Public Library. It is the home of the Connecticut Genealogical Society (now the Connecticut Ancestry Society Inc.) and it's Stamford Room is a treasure trove of information on Connecticut history and genealogy. It is 35 miles (one hour in good traffic) from NYC via the Tappan Zee Bridge, I-287 and I-95. Exit at the Stamford RR Station, go through the first traffic light to the second light and turn left. Go north to Broad Street and turn right. It is several blocks up on the left, just before Macys (on the right). There is parking in Caldor's, entrance on Summer St, just before Broad St., or just beyond the library, at a municipal garage on the left. (\$5.30 @ 8 hours)

The collection includes a large number of genealogies, including some Dutch families, but mostly New England Families. The library receives hundreds of genealogical society newsletters from around the US, including many family newsletters.
