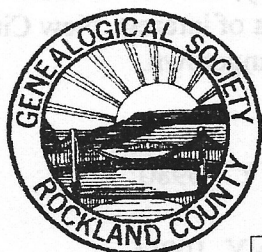

### Saturday, July 31. A Summer's Evening in Camp.

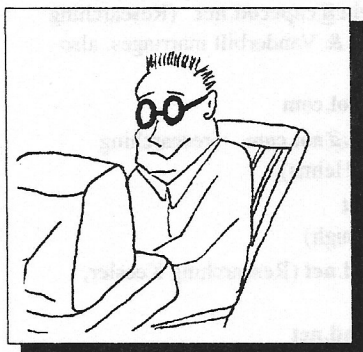
Stroll through a Continental Army Camp.

## They're Gathering!

Come to the Rockland Gathering! Between 10 AM and 4 PM on June 26<sup>th</sup> at the Historical Society of Rockland County's lovely museum and Blauvelt House, 20 Zukor Road in New City. Admission to an entire day of fun and fact finding with your "cousins" is free and the weather should be terrific! In case of rain, the Historical Society will be open to us. All your kith and kin have been in-vited, and we are hoping to see representatives from all of the Hudson Valley counties and the northern half of New Jersey! In fact, we have already heard that groups from as far as Monmouth County, NJ and Dutchess County, New York are planning to attend!

The purpose of the Gathering, is to provide a free exchange of information. For those just starting to trace their roots, the beginners' table will be manned by experienced ancestor hunters. For the more advanced, well, bring your research notes, your laptop or your tape recorder and be prepared to exchange information and family folklore with new friends and relatives.

## Directions

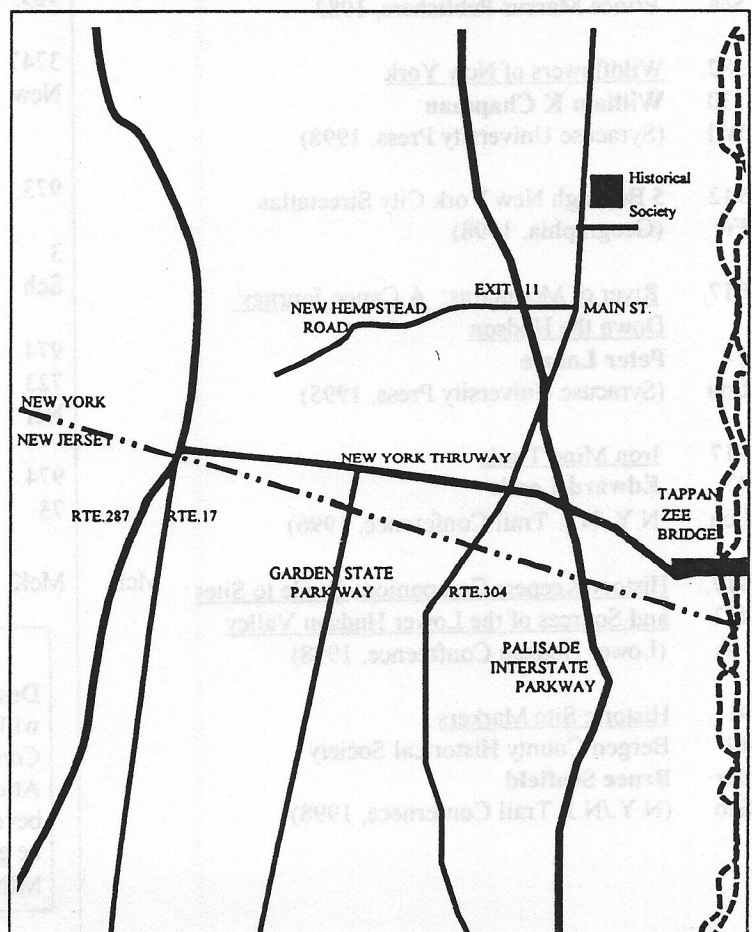
**From the New York State Thruway**, exit onto the Palisades Interstate Parkway (Exit 13N); proceed north to Exit 11.

Turn Right on New Hempstead Road take it to the end at Main Street.

Turn left and follow Main Street thru town. After several lights, the road comes to a three way intersection.(Main becomes Zukor Rd.), go straight. The Historical Society is on the right.

**From Rtes. 17, 287, or the Garden State Parkway**, go north to the New York State Thruway and follow it toward New York City. Continue with directions above.

**From Long Island**, come across the GWB Take the Palisades Interstate Parkway North to Exit 11. Continue with directions above.

## ROCKLAND COUNTY MESSENGER

### A weekly newspaper published at Haverstraw, NY

A microfilm available at the New City Public Library contains many copies of this old newspaper. All issues were not available at filming, some that were had been snipped, and others were in poor condition. Notices of marriage & death were copied as they were found. The microfilm begins with the Thursday, July 29th, 1847 issue.

### March 20, 1851

**Married-** On the 16th inst. by the Rev. S.D. Lougheed, Mr. Jackson Rose to Miss Emily Leet, all of Haverstraw

### March 27, 1851

**Died-** in this village on the 26th inst. Emma Rebecca Rider, neice of Edward Denoyelles Esq. in the 16th year of her age.

### April 3, 1851

**Married-** on the 29th inst. by the Rev. S.D. Lougheed, Mr. Alexander Mathers to Miss. Sarah Ann Post, all of Ramapo, Rockland County.

**Married-** At Stamford Conn. on the 24th inst. by the Rev. Mr. Twist, Mr. Nathaniel Hubbard to Miss. Hannah Betts, both of Greenwich.

**Died-** On the 25th inst. Catherine, wife of Mr. George Weiant, aged 62 years.

**Died-** In New York City on the 25th ult. Jacob Hauptman, of Dropsy, aged 42 years, 1 Month, 11 days.

### April 10, 1851

**Married-** On the 2nd. inst by John Hunting Esq., Mr. John P. Churchill to Miss. Josephine Sanders, both of Haverstraw.

### April 17, 1851

**Married-** On the 14th inst. by the Rev. John W. McDoughall, Mr. Lewis Snyder to Miss. Luisa Wisick, all of Haverstraw.

### April 24, 1851

**Died-** At the residence of his son in Clarkstown, on the 15th inst. Mr. William J. Waldron, formerly of New York, in the 77th. year of his age.

**Died-** April 9th at Herrington, Bergen County, NJ Jacob Sheldon, son of John and Mary R. Herring, aged 9 months, 8 days.

### May 1, 1851

**Married-** In New York on the 23rd of April by the Rev. Mr. Eddy, Mr. Thomas M. Rose to Miss. Abby J. Williams, all of New York.

**Married-** on the 23rd. ult. by the Rev. S.D. Lougheed, Mr. Thomas W. Rose to Miss. Ann Marks, all of North Haverstraw, Rockland Co.

### May 8, 1851

**Married-** at the parsonage on the 27th of April by the Rev. Charles S. Hageman, Mr. Joseph Moore of N.Y. to Miss. Amanda Decker, of Nyack.

**Died-** in New York on the 1st. inst. Mrs. Catherine Miller, aged 70 years.

**Died-** in this place on the 27th. ult. Mrs. Elizabeth Nye, aged 72 years.

### May 29, 1851

**Died-** in this place on the 26th inst. Benjamin Coe. Esq. much regretted by a large circle of friends and acquaintances, in the 56 th year of his age.

### June 12, 1851

**Married-** At N. Haverstraw on the 5th. inst. by Rev. J.H. Towbridge, Mr. Nathan Nickerson to Miss. Sophia, daughter of Brewster Brooks, all of that place.

### June 19, 1851

**Married-** At Haverstraw on the 15th. inst. by Rev. A.S. Freeman, William Cook to Maria Betz, all of Haverstraw.

### June 26, 1851

**Died-** In this village on the 20th. inst. Dereka, wife of the late Judge DeNoyelles, aged 78 years, 9 months, 20 days. {Obituary follows, not transcribed. Ed.}

### July 3, 1851

**Died-** At Newburgh, Orange Co. on the 25th. day of June, Elizabeth Gardner, aged 81 years, 2 months, 8 days. She was the widow of the late Silas Gardner and the mother of B.D. Gardner, Silas D. Gardner and John D. Gardner of Haverstraw.

**Died-** In N. Haverstraw on the 1st. Inst. Mr. Matthew VanWart, aged 19 years.

(marriage record as John Ekkerson & Maria Van Derbilt, van N. Hemsted) signed "Maria Ekkerson"

"At the Battle of White Plains, one of my neighbors, Asbraham Onderdonk, was killed when a British cannonball blew his head off. I also volunteered in the Bergen Co. Militia under Capt.'s Thomas Blanch & Abraham Haring. I know the following men who can testify as to my war service: Cornelius, Richard and Garrte Blauvelt, John C. & Abraham Smith, .....Sickles.

Rockland Co., NY Common Pleas Court, 13 May 1843, Ann Blauvelt, age 78, a resident of Orange, Rockland Co., NY, widow of John G. Blauvelt, who died 15 Mar 1842. Married Nov, 1782, had one child, Elizabeth, born 7 Apr 1784.

Was paroled with my father, who was also a prisoner of war.

I was in a scouting party with Cornelius Huyler and Henry Vanderhoff. Living at New Barbados, Bergen Co.,

NJ at close of war; then to Watervilet, Albany Co., NY; then to Minisink, Orange Co., NY; then to Orange Township, Rockland Co., NY; then to Franklin Township, Bergen Co., NJ; then back to Orange Township; then to NYC.

Served under Lt. David Demarest, Ensign Samuel Verbryck, and Capt. Van Hase (?) in the White Coat Cavalry. Other mentioned in pension: Rev. Cornelius T. Demarest, Benjamin Romain, both of NYC

Testifying as fellow soldiers in 1833: Sylvester Marius of NYC; Samuel Demarest of Watervilet, Albany Co., NY.

Bowers burial site is unknown. He was a cordwainer by trade and lived in the Warwick area of Orange Co., NY until about 1785 when he moved to Nyack (Clarkstown), Rockland Co., NY.

## Research in the New York Archives by Anne O'Connor

### Program presented at the March 23, 1999 meeting of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County.

The National Archives Branch at Varick and Houston Streets, New York City, has been the most useful place to research, and it is most comfortable. Ms. O'Connor's ancestors moved around a lot. She was born in New York City and enjoys going there for the day. It is best to go during the week, especially on Monday, as the Archives become very crowded on weekends. It is located on the 12th floor, and when you enter you are asked to put all your belongings in a locker. You are allowed to take in only a pencil and pad and are given a basic booklet describing the archives.

One should look at the microfilm index books first to determine the number of the microfilm wanted and the cabinet where it is located. There are many types of records to be found there: All Federal Census records from 1790 to 1920--the 1870 census is on CD-ROM, the 1920 census is soundexed; ship's passenger lists; naturalization records, which can include occupation and language spoken; the index for military records (not the records themselves; they have to be sent for on a special form); draft records for World War I, which are generally not very valuable for family research; State index of births, marriages and deaths; many concentration camp records; directories for New York City (you have to know where the family was living).

Regarding the Federal census records, the 1870 census lists where the parents were born; the 1880 census is not indexed, except if there was a child under 10 years of age; the 1900 census lists the number of years a couple was married; the 1890 Federal census doesn't exist, since it was burned, but there is the 1890 police census of Manhattan, and Brooklyn has the State 1892 census. Ms. O'Connor noted that when looking at a family on the census, one should look at the families before and after that family, since many times there are other people in the family group, possibly in-laws,

parents, brothers and sisters, living next door or on the same street.

Naturalization records before 1907 may not contain very much information. After 1907, more questions were asked on the application. Ship passenger lists are not all indexed from 1846-1891, but there are some substitutes that can be used; i.e., books, such as Filby, "The Famine Immigrants, Russian Immigration, "Germans to America." The New York Public Library is another good place to do research while in the city. Weekdays are the best to go, with the exception of Monday when the genealogical room is not open. The Library has New York City directories from 1796 to the 1930's.

To research New York City birth and death records, you can go to Chambers Street, where the following records can be found: "Bodies in Transit," Wills and Administrations, City Naturalizations, and City Directories (in book form), the 1855 State census on microfilm. One should note that the Brooklyn death records are not complete. In the 1840's and 1850's, Brooklyn was much smaller, until it later became the City of Brooklyn. It is important to get there promptly at 9 a.m. in order to get a reader, which by the way, aren't very good. These facilities also aren't very comfortable.

In all cases, before making the trip to New York, plan in advance what you will be looking for in order to maximize your time.
