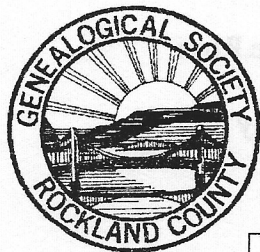

ROCKLAND COUNTY MESSENGER

A weekly newspaper published at Haverstraw, NY

A microfilm available at the New City Public Library contains many copies of this old newspaper. All issues were not available at filming, some that were had been snipped, and others were in poor condition. Notices of marriage & death were copied as they were found. The microfilm begins with the Thursday, July 29th, 1847 issue.

July 10, 1851

Died- On Wednesday evening July 2nd. James Gunton, son of Henry and Caroline Gunton, aged 5 years, 5 months, 12 days.

Died- In Nyack on the 3rd. inst.. Mr. A.C. Demarest, in the 60th year of his age.

Married- At Setauket, Long Island, on the morning of the 1st. inst.. by the Rev. Mr. Evans, Mr. Michael A. Archer of Haverstraw to Mrs. Mary A. Watson, daughter of the Rev. William C. Tooker.

Married- On the 3rd inst.. by John Hunting Esq., Mr. Theodore Saunders to Miss. Fanny Keesler, all of north Haverstraw.

July 17, 1851

Married- At Newark NJ on the morning of the 7th. inst.. by the Rev. Mr. Corbit, Mr. Sylvester Westervelt of Haverstraw to Miss. Eliza Frances VanName, dau. of John VanName Esq. of the former place.

July 24, 1851

Married- On the 20th inst.. by the Rev. T.K. Witsil, Mr. James Hurring to Miss. Hannah Secore, all of Haverstraw.

July 31, 1851

Married- On the 19th inst.. by the Rev. J.S. Swaim, Mr. Hagaman Onderdonk, Sheriff of Rockland Co. to Miss. Amanda, daughter of John G. Perry, all of the village of Nyack.

Aug 7, 1851

Died- at his residence in Savanna, Carrol County, Illinois, of cholera, on Sunday night the 20th. of July, Rev. James Hildreth, aged 38, Pastor of the Presbyterian Church of that place, also at the same time and place Theodore and Mary Rutgers, children of the same, aged the first 2 years and 3 months, the latter 10 months. They all died within one hour of each other and are buried together.

Died- At NY on Sunday, 3rd. inst.. Cornelius B., son of Benjamin C. and Maria Jane Bogert, aged 7 years, 3 months, 16 days.

Aug 21, 1851

Married- In NY on Thursday, the 7th inst.. By Rev. R. C. Putney, Mr. Meltier Nye to Miss. Margaret Gains. Both of Haverstraw NY

Sept 4, 1851

Married- On the 27th inst.. by the Rev. S.D. Loughheed, Mr. Richard H. Cook to Miss. Jane Onderdonk, all of Rockland Lake, NY

Married- At NY on the 24th inst.. by Mr. John Forte, John W. Smith of Haverstraw to Miss. Margaret E. Holmes of Richmond Valley, Staten Island.

Sept 11, 1851

Married- On the 3rd. inst.. by Rev. J.H. Troubridge, Mr. Watson Tompkins to Miss. Amanda, daughter of the Hon. G.S. Allison, all of this place.

Married- On the morning of the 27th. ult. by the Rev. A.S. Freeman, Mr. John W. Weiant to Miss. Jane Drake, all of Haverstraw.

Died- At the residence of his brother William Knight Esq., of North Haverstraw, Mr. Henry Knight, in the 31st year of his age.

Sept 18, 1851

Died- In this village on the 14th inst.. Mr. Abraham J. Snedeker, after a long and lingering illness, much regretted by a large circle of friends, in the 31st year of his age.

Died- In this village on the 8th inst.. Ambrosia, only daughter of William and Catherine Wood, in the 3rd, year of her age.

Oct. 2, 1851

Married- At N. Haverstraw on the 24th. inst.. by Rev. J.H. Trowbridge, Mr. Peter VanValer of New York to Miss. Sarah Knight, of the former place.

Married- On the 23rd ult. by the Rev. J.H. Trowbridge, Mr. Christie Eske to Miss. Anna Hillman, all of this place.

Volunteers at the Archives

BERGEN PENSION ABSTRACTS

Genealogical Abstracts of Revolutionary War Pension Applications relating to Bergen Co. NJ and Rockland Co. NY. *Contributed by Philip O'Leary*

Abraham Hopper. Abraham A. & Elizabeth (VanHorn) Hopper. Abraham A. Hopper, Pvt., NJ Militia, Rev. War Pension # W251, Bergen Co. NJ Common Pleas Court, 9 Nov. 1854.
Elizabeth Hopper (VanHorn), age 82, resident of Hoppertown, Bergen Co., NJ b. 1 Jan 1773, widow of Abraham A. Hopper, married 18 Aug. 1793.

The following is a compilation of the testimonies of Steven Westervelt, age 93, a fellow soldier, in Bergen Co., NJ Court 13 Feb. 1860, and S.G. Dodge, of Washington DC, on 21 Nov. 1859. "...Hoppertown, or Paramus as it is now known, was of such great military importance that no zealous and brave Whig could have lived there from 1778-1779 without being in service a great part of the time... Bergen Co., NJ, being a river county, and so near to NYC, was involved in the war almost all the time...all able bodied men in the county were called into service performing some kind of military duty, and at times the whole population of Bergen Co. were under arms...all the US Army stores were placed in the custody of Hoppertown and required a great deal of vigilance on the part of the neighborhood, to guard it from the British Army. Abraham A. Hopper and his six brothers, all soldiers in the Revolution, were well known for their zeal and patriotism. The British Army burned the houses of Abraham A. Hopper's father, who quartered men and supplies, and his brother, Capt. John A. Hopper.
