Letter of Petition from Sarah Scott, widow, to Hon. A. Edward Suffern, Surrogate of Rockland County, dated 25 Nov. 1878.

The petition of **Sarah Scott** of the Town of Orangetown, in said County, respectfully sheweth that **Abraham Scott**, of the Town of Orangetown in said County, departed this life at said Town on the sixteenth day of October, in the year 1878 having previously made and executed his last will and testament in which he devised and bequeathed both real and personal estate, and in which he appointed your petitioner as executrix thereof:

That said deceased left him surviving no child or children, nor any descendant of any child or children, but left him surviving **Sarah Scott**, his petitioner, his widow, and **John Scott** and **James (M) Scott** of Orangetown; **Stephen Scott** of Ramapo; and **Henry Scott**, **Oliver (W.) Scott** & **Hiram Scott** of Clarkstown, County of Rockland, his brothers. And **John A. Scott**, **Jacob Scott**, **Oliver (H.) Scott**, **William Scott**, **Ellen M. Gurdenier**, wife of **Bernard Gurdenier**, all of Nyack, Rockland Co., and **James (W.) Scott** of Sing Sing, Westchester Co., and **Arminta Wyman**, wife of **John Wyman** of the City of New York, and **Maria E. Burris**, wife of **Callender Burris** of the City of New York, children of **William (H.) Scott**, deceased, a brother of Testator.

And **Caroline DeGroat** and **Julia Chapman**, wife of **Charles D. Chapman** of the City of New York, children of **Barbara DeGroat**, deceased, wife of **Richard DeGroat** and sister of Testator; **Henry Calvin Remsen** and **Franklyn Remsen** of Woodside, State of New Jersey, children of **Margaret Jane Remsen**, deceased, wife of **Isaac E. Remsen**, and daughter of **Barbara DeGroat** aforesaid;

Elsie Ackerman and **Lillie May Ackerman**, formerly of Troy, NY, but present residence unknown, children of **Ellen Ackerman**, deceased, wife of **John Ackerman** and daughter of **Barbara DeGroat** aforesaid; **William H. Daily** of the City of New York, son of **Catherine Maria Daily** deceased, wife of **William Daily** and daughter of **Barbara DeGroat** aforesaid.

John Wilkinson, **Margaret Ternure**, wife of **Michael Ternure**, **Catherine Ronk**, wife of **Stephen Ronk** of Ramapo, **Julia Taylor**, wife of **Aaron Taylor**, **Jane Messenger**, wife of **Abram Messenger** of Orangetown, County of Rockland, children of **Jane Wilkerson**, deceased, wife of **Henry Wilkerson** and sister of Testator.

Chapman** and **William Chapman**, of the City of New York, children of **Catherine Chapman**, deceased, wife of **Charles Chapman** and daughter of **Elizabeth DeGroat**, deceased.

All of the said persons are of free age except **Elsie Ackerman**, **Lillie May Ackerman**, **William H. Daily**, **Charles H. Chapman** and **William Chapman**. That the estate of which deceased died seized and possessed does not exceed in value the sum of Five Hundred Dollars; and that said deceased was at or immediately previous to his death, an inhabitant of the County of Rockland, and your petitioner being desirous that said last will and testament should be duly proved, your petitioner prays that a citation may issue out of and under the seal of the court, requiring the said next of kin and heirs at law of said deceased personally to be and appear at a time and place herein mentioned and attend the probate of said will.

I, Sarah Scott, the petitioner named in the forgoing petition, being duly sworn, do depose and swear that I know the contents thereof, and that the matters of fact therein stated are true to my best information and belief.

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ANSWERS TO QUERIES

202 - Conklin, Youmans, Blake

[This query appeared in the June, 1999 Newsletter. An answer was posted in the Sept. 1999 Newsletter by M. Smeltzer Stevenot. The saga continued with an answer to the answer posted in the June 2000 Newsletter by Debi Starr. Now, believe it or not, we have an answer to the answer to the answer!]

The Editor is hopeful that the matter will end here, and that all interested parties will endeavor to sort things out between themselves and not through the pages of this Newsletter. If members feel compelled to express themselves further on this subject, it is suggested they correspond with the submitter of the original query, who seems to have been forgotten.]

Answer (202). Margaret Matilda **Conklin**, wife of Daniel **Starr** Jr., was age one in the 1850 census, daughter of William G. Conklin and Sabrina Wright; age 16 in the 1865 census. Wesley Chapel Records say she was of Ladentown. Her eldest son was William, presumably named for his grandfather (no son named Sylvester). Death certificates can be helpful but are not infallible. Even relatives can make errors. The only Sylvester **Conklin** I have found was born circa 1850, son of Seymour **Conklin**. Further search for Sylvester is suggested.

Genealogical Abstracts of Revolutionary War Pension Applications relating to Bergen Co., NJ and Rockland Co., NY. *Contributed by Philip O'Leary*

Cornelius D. Board, Pvt., NJ Militia and Continental Line. Revolutionary War Pension No. R 974. Genessee Co., NY, Common Pleas Court, 10 June 1834, Cornelius D. Board, age 70, resident of Warsaw, Genessee Co., NY; b. 28 Jan 1764, Saddle River Twp., Bergen Co., NJ. My brother who lives in NJ has a record of my birth.

In 1790 I moved to Fairlawn, Rutland Co., Vermont, then to Castletown, same county; May 1811, moved to Olean, Cattaraugus Co., NY; in April 1816 moved to Rushford, Allegheny Co., NY; in spring of 1823, moved to Centerville, same county; in Sept. 1831 moved to present place. Served under Lt. John Nafee in the Bergen Co., Militia. I was involved, mostly with some South Carolina troops, in the recapture at Smith's Clove, NY, of some arms and household goods that were stolen by the cowboys [British soldiers] from Bergen Co., NJ; also involved in the recapture of some Negroes and horse in the Ramapo Mountains, that were taken from Ringwood by the Cowboys. While on sentry duty, arrested John Robison who escaped from the Morristown jail.

I also served in a Continental Line regiment we called the "Hairy Corps." I was at a camp in Hackensack called "The Sign of the Three Pigeons" where John Berry, called "Jack the Regular," one of the Cowboys who had boasted that he had killed 48 people, was himself killed.

In 1778, I was one of only 28 soldiers in Capt. Joseph Board's company, among whom were some Negroes..., the reason being that most of the inhabitants of Saddle River Twp., were in the British [Tories] interest.

I know Gen. Knox, Cols. Barber, Ogden and DeHart; Maj. Cummings, and Capt. DeHart, all of the Jersey Line; Rev. Ezra Scovel and Judge Samuel McWorter of Genessee Co., NY, who can testify as to my war service.

Barkeeper- another name for toll keeper.

Belhoste- Tavern keeper.

Barton / Bartoner- in charge of the monastic farm.

Basil Worker- worked with sheep and goat skins.

Bass / Bast Dresser- worked in dressing fiber or matting.

Batman- Officers servant in the army.

Batt Maker- made batting for mattresses, quilts.

Battledore Maker- made dust beaters for clothes and carpets, later made washing machine paddles.

Baxter- Baker

Bayweaver- wove fine woolen cloth (bay/baize)

Beadle / Bedel / Bedell- parish officer who kept order, also was town crier.

Bead Piercer- drilled holes in beads.

Beamer- wound the "warp" on the loom roller.

Bearer- carried coal in underground mines.

Beater- cleansed and thickened cloth.

Beaver- made felt for hats.

Bedman- Sexton.

Bedral- minor church official in Scotland.

Bedwevere- made webbing for bed frames.

Beeskepmaker- made beehives.

Beetler- In textile trade, operated beetling machine.

Belleyetere- Bell founder.

Bellfounder / Belter / Belliter- belt maker.

Bell Hanger- hung bells in churches.

Bellman- watchman, town crier, letter carrier, walked streets ringing a bell.

Bellowfarmer- cared for church organ.

Bellows Maker- made bellows for organs, smiths.

Belly Builder- built and fitted piano interiors.

Bender- Leather cutter.

Besswarden- parish appointee to care for animals.

Besom Maker- broom maker.

Biddy- female servant, usually Irish.

Billier / Billyman- operated a Billy Roller, a machine in the cotton industry.

Bill Poster- put up signs, notices, etc.

Binder- bound books, hats, etc.

Bird Boy- employed to chase birds from crops.

Bird Catcher- You all know what he did!

Bird nest seller- Sold bird nests, complete with eggs, to be hatched for pets.

Birlyman- in Scotland, a ground officer, or parish arbiter.

Black Tray Maker- made Japanned trays.

Blacking maker- made shoe polish.

Black Borderer- made black edge stationery for funerals.

Bladesmith- made knives or swords.

Blaxter / Bleacher- bleached cloth or paper pulp.

Blemmere- Plumber.

Blentonist- water diviner.

Blindsman- Post Office worker who dealt with incorrectly addresses letters and parcels.

Blocker / Blockmaker- made wooden blocks used in the hat business, or laid the blocks for ship keels.

Block Printer- printer who used wooden blocks.

Bloodman / Bloodletter- used leeches to let blood

Bloomer- produced iron from ore, a bloom smithy.

Blower- glass blower; a bellows operator.

Blowfeeder- fed the fibers into a blowing machine.

Bluestocking- female writer.

Bluffer- Inn keeper, landlord of a pub.

Boarding Officer- inspected ships entering port.

Boardman- truant officer; tenant of manorial land

Boardwright- carpenter who made tables, chairs.

Boatman- worked on a boat on rivers, canals.

Boatswain- officer in charge of sails and rigging.

Bobber- metal polisher; unloaded fishing boats.

Bobbin Carrier- worked in spinning and weaving section of the mill.

Bobbin Turner- made bobbins used in spinning and weaving industry.

Bobby- Policeman, constable.

Bodeys / Body Maker- made bodices for woman's garments.

Bodger- craftsman who made wooden chair legs.

Boilermaker- industrial metal worker.

Boiler Plater- made rolled iron plate for boilers.

Boll- cared for power looms in weaving industry.

Bolter- sifted meal.
