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WHAT'S NEW IN THE SOCIETY ??

What's new in the Genealogical Society? Plenty! Over the past summer the Board of Directors agreed that a change of meeting place was needed. While the society has always been welcomed at the Historical Society of Rockland County, the board felt that a change of venue might invigorate the society, and that a more public meeting place would attract new members. In that regard negotiations were opened with the New City Public Library. These discussions culminated September 27th, when an agreement was signed by President George Fee and Library Director Richard Treleven. Under the terms of the agreement, the New City Library will provide space in the Rockland Room for the Society's library books and vertical files. The Library will co-sponsor Society meetings and provide publicity for society activities. The Society agreed to provide four hours of volunteer assistance weekly in the Rockland Room to library patrons doing genealogical research. GSRC member Richard Peterson will act as liaison with Local History Librarian Sally Pellegrini. GSRC meetings will be held on the fourth Tuesday of each month, at 7:00 pm, in the meeting room at the library.

WHERE IS THE SOCIETY LIBRARY NOW?

There are two shelves in the Rockland Room which are dedicated to books from the Society collection. The Society has many books which mirror those already found at the library, so only books that are unique to the Rockland Room will be placed there. The remainder of the Society collection will be temporarily housed on book shelves in the conference room at the Rockland County Archives, Building S, Robert Yeager Health Center, Pomona where they will be accessible to the public.

A Letter from The Society of Descendants of Johannes De La Montagne

Genealogical Society of Rockland County
18 August, 2000

This is a comment on an article in the GSRC newsletter, Vol. 13, No. 4, pp. 12, of June, 1999

[*Non Population Schedules, 1865 N.Y. State Census. Ed.*]

The article reads: Marriages that occurred in the 1st Election District of Ramapo, Rockland County, during the year ending 1 June 1865. . . Benjamin Margeson, age 25, married to Mary Ann Montanya, age 20, 7 April, W. Milford ME Church.

According to the records of the West Milford M.E. Church, found in the library at Ringwood State Park, Blue Notebook #5, Mary Ann Montanya was married to David Margeson.

I don't know what happened to David, but believe his father or grandfather was Benjamin Margeson. Mary Ann (Montanya) Margeson married #2, John Bedford, on 20 Oct 1866, according to *Marriages of Bergen County, pp. 114*.

On the US Federal Census of 1880, a Benjamin is listed as a child of John Bedford. I believe him to be a child of David Margeson, noting his birth date of 1865, before Mary Ann and John Bedford were married.

Do you have a "Next Friend?"

While doing volunteer work at the Rockland Co. Archives, GSRC member Maryann Smith came across several references in court papers pertaining to a "Next Friend" in a case filed 30 April, 1857.

Abstract . . . the defendant has put in a general answer to the complaint by her next friend, which answer does not deny . . .

Abstract . . . by Abram A. Demarest, her next friend answering the complaint of . . .

Abstract . . . Mr. Edward Suffern appearing as the counsel for the next friend of the defendant.

The term "next friend" being unknown to Maryann, she visited the library and checked a copy of *Blacks Law Dictionary*, where she found the following.

Next Friend. *One acting for benefit of infant, or other person not sui juris [person unable to look after his or her own interests or manage his or her own lawsuit], without being regularly appointed guardian. A "next friend" is not a party to an action, but is an officer of the court, especially appearing to look after the interests of the minor or disabled person whom he represents. Such person is not substantially different in many jurisdictions from "guardian ad litem;" their functions being generally the same.*

And now you know the REST of the story.

N.Y. State Archives discontinues service

The N.Y. State Archives and Records Administration has discontinued its service of answering mail in requests for searches of its vital records index. Loss of staff was cited as the reason for the cutback. Researchers will now have to visit the State Archives or the National Archives regional branch in New York City to view the indexes.

New York Marble Cemetery

Have you an ancestor buried in a marble vault in New York City? Beneath a half acre garden in Manhattan's East Village, off 2nd Ave., at 2nd St., is the New York Marble Cemetery, the oldest nonsectarian cemetery in Manhattan. More than 2000 people have been laid in its 156 vaults, constructed of 100% Tuckahoe marble.

Today the walls are crumbling, and names are being slowly eroded by time. Owners have formed a committee to raise money to begin a restoration.

The cemetery was founded in 1830 after an outbreak of yellow fever. Residents feared a risk of contagion if the dead were buried in the ground. The last burial took place in 1937. Current owners may still use the vaults.

Mrs. Anne Brown, who is researching the cemetery's history says, "only 3 % of an ancestor's great great great grandchildren share the ancestor's last name."

The VanHouten Collection of the Rockland County Historical Society

While researching collateral connections to the VanHouten family, I became involved with a line of inquiry which stretches from Rockland and Bergen counties, to upstate New York, Ohio, and eventually the west coast. After a year of research, the report in my Family Tree Maker program included over a thousand individuals, my e-mail address book was sporting at least a dozen new contacts, and my fingers had become shorter and unusually bent from typing, typing, typing! It was time to call it quits. The line from Roelof Cornelisen, the earliest recognized emigrant to New Amsterdam and Rensselaerwyck, to my Van Houten auntie was completely connected, as was half the total population of two states, or so it seemed.

My cousin and co-researcher, Lyda and I vowed - no more - we'll just update what we have and set this line aside, a job well done. And then the fateful e-mail arrived. Someone in Canada had seen an old query of mine on the Van Houten Genforum and was requesting the applicable reference. No problem, I had quoted from a manuscript in the New City Library by Justus Richard Van Houten. That was that, back to the typing. But the following night the same person contacted me again, thanks for the source, but what about by the end of the week, we were into a serious dialogue about that manuscript. My new contact, Bruce Hopper, decided to try and track down the good Brother for clarification.

Justus Van Houten responded telling Bruce that he based the manuscript on a "chest" of family papers dating back to the early 1800s which he had donated to some place in Rockland County in 1982, and he no longer remembered where. Between Bruce's urging and Marie Koestler's excellent memory, I tracked down the documents at the Historical Society of Rockland County and arranged to go see them.

Soon after, Bruce came down from Canada to do some on site research. He linked up with Lyda and me, and we all trooped off to take a look see. Between Bruce furiously copying documents with his personal copier, and Lyda and myself trying to organize the mound of papers, wills, etc., in the collection, we must have looked like a stationary ticker tape.

Partly for our own benefit and partly as a thank you to the HSRC, Lyda and I have put together a rudimentary index of the collection, which I have included with this article. *[placed with the GSRC collection]* Copies will also be given to the HSRC and the Rockland Room at the New City Library. The occasional misspellings in the index come from the documents themselves.

We maintained the spelling variations as they appear, so the same name on different documents may be spelled in different ways. Where there were dates, we have tried to include them, the accession number, and a brief description for each item.
