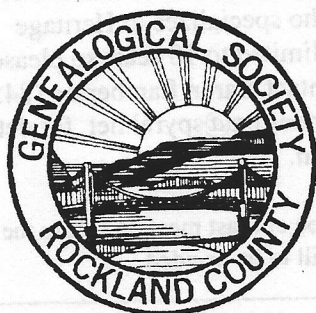

**April 2003 - Either Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup>** - a cosponsored trip with the New City Library to NYC - call for details or check our web site.

**Sat., May 31, 10:00 a.m. at the New City Library - "Civil War Nurses,"** presented by Britta Arendt.

Who were they? How did they receive a commission? Why did their families disown them? And how to research them.

Learn something about the societal role of women in mid-nineteenth century America and how the Civil War changed those roles. Find out how they obtained appointments, the types of duties that were required of them, and what was their impact on the war and society.

Britta completed her Masters in Public History and Museum Studies at the U. of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Her varied experience includes work at the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago, and the National Museum of Civil War Medicine in Frederick, Md. She has researched women's roles during the Civil War, and the evolution of women's dress from 1840-1900, and also participates in Civil War reenactments as a nurse as well as a *vivandiere* of the 114<sup>th</sup> Pa. Volunteers, Collis' Zouaves.

**5TH ANNUAL ROCKLAND GATHERING**

Much is being planned to make this a gala occasion! The Society for Creative Anachronisms will be with us for the day. They will set up a medieval fair on the lawn and show us what life was like on Market Day in the middle ages. Arts, crafts, games, and armaments will be demonstrated. **GSRC MEETING NOTES from 28 Jan 2003**

(from Joan Brooks)

**"Searching for Ancestors", by Ira Berk**

Ira, a GSRC member for 1½ years, has been working "at a snail's pace" on his family for 25 years. A long time ago, his mother told him he had a cousin who was a famous writer, **Konrad Bercovici** (1882-1961). Konrad, who was born in Braila, Romania, and died in New York City, wrote books and articles on social items, as well as an autobiography which Ira read many years ago along with such other articles by Bercovici as he could find.

When he decided to reread the autobiography, he had trouble finding it, but finally located it through the **Ramapo-Catskill Library system**. People advised him that when libraries have to make room for new books they discard the old ones, so a book should be taken out, or inquired about, at least once a year to keep it active and on the shelves.

Ira has done much of his research at the **Finkelstein Library in Spring Valley**, where he has studied geography and history in relation to Iasi (aka Jasi), Romania, where his father was born. He noted that, even though Bercovici mentioned some relatives in his autobiography, Ira didn't find any connections to his own grandfather. He has some documents at home, which provide some clues, such as a naturalization certificate; however, it doesn't give the year, port, and ship of entry. Ira stated that his direct ancestors went from Romania to Liverpool to NY's lower East Side. He did find some relatives who came in through Ellis Island, but not his father and grandfather.

Ira has his grandfather's Fulton Centennial Writing Medal received around 1909, and he'd like to find out



more about the organization that sponsored the contest. He also has postcards of the centennial celebration in 1909. He did not locate an obituary for Konrad in the New York Times.

Ira says he realizes that he should concentrate more on both sides of the family, not just the famous ancestor. In hindsight, he also realized that, while he had the chance when he was younger, he should have asked questions of relatives. He also is questioning when the surname was changed from Berkoveici to Berk. He is surmising that his father might have changed it for business reasons.

In conclusion, Ira admits that he still has a lot of work to do in New York City.

In the discussion afterwards, members made some other suggestions worth remembering:

Look for the **Declaration of Intent** to become a citizen, probably about five years prior to the actual Certificate of Naturalization. It will give much more information, such as date of emigration, ship, port, etc.

**Castle Garden** processed immigrants from about 1855 - 1890. Ellis Island arrivals didn't start until 1892.

Go to **NYC court records** to check for change of name.

Contact the **NYC Historical Society** for information on this family; they have a website also.

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**Ed. comment:** An interesting case (& see p. 15)...

A lengthy obituary for Bercovici is in the **NY Times** of **28 Dec 1961, page 27**, seen in the NYG&BS ProQuest search module (he died on 27 Dec).

He immigrated 1915-1916, and is in the **1920 US census for Morris Twp., Morris, NJ** (NARA film T625-1061, ED 29, sh. 2a, fam. 30). As an author (**Library of Congress web site**) he inclined to the left. A 'Google' search turns up a lot of misc. material on Konrad Bercovici. One web site says:

"Some sources credit the initial concept for the [Charlie Chaplin] film [The Great Dictator] with a 1937 conversation between Chaplin and film producer Alexander Korda. However, Konrad Bercovici, a writer and close friend of Chaplin, sued Chaplin for five million dollars in 1942, claiming to be the author of the original story. The case was eventually settled for approximately \$90,000. Such lawsuits over creative works are hardly uncommon. .... However, Bercovici's case appears to have some merit: for her 1997 biography of Chaplin, Joyce Milton uncovered Bercovici's original treatment and quoted it at length. She suggests that Chaplin's failure to give credit was due at least in part to a desire to distance himself from Bercovici, who had run afoul of

the Communist Party (with which Chaplin associated) thanks to his comparisons of Stalin to Hitler."

♦ Bergen Co. NJ, Common Pleas Court, 02 May 1842, Cornelius Terhune, age 80, brother of Elizabeth "Betsy" Earl.

Children of Morris Earl and Elizabeth "Betsy" Terhune:

♦ Rockland Co. NY, Common Pleas Court, 08 Jun 1839, Sarah Blauvelt, formally Van Dalsen, age 79, a resident of Orange Twp, Rockland Co. NY, widow of Richard Blauvelt, b. 05 May 1759, and who d. 20 Sep 1837. Married 16 Apr 1781, by Rev. Samuel Verbryck.

Children of Richard Blauvelt and Sarah Van Dalsen:

1) John R., b. 11 Feb 1782, of Harrington Twp, Bergen Co. NJ, as of 08 Jun 1839.

2) Gitty, b. 06 Oct 1784, d. 22 Mar 1791.

3) Richard, b. 18 May 1787.

4) Boy (no name), b. 18 Aug 1790, d. 15 hrs later, bur. 19 Aug 1790.

Others mentioned in pension: Cornelius J. Smith and wife Sally, of Orange Twp, Rockland Co. NY, as of 08 Jun 1839; Rev. Isaac Cole, pastor of the RDC Tappan, NY; Garret C. Bogert, Richard D. ### **Jacob and Anne/Aniche (DeClark) Onderdonk**

**Jacob Onderdonk, Capt. NY Militia, Revolutionary War Pension No. W17525**

♦ Rockland Co. NY Common Pleas Court, 26 Sep 1837, Anne Remson, age 91, formally DeClark, a resident of Clarkstown, Rockland Co. NY, widow of Johannis Remson, who d. 13 Dec 1813, m. 28 Mar 1796, by Rev. Nicholas Lansing. Also the widow of Capt. Jacob Onderdonk, who d. 19 May 1795, m. 01 Dec 1765, by Rev. Samuel Verbryck.

Jacob Onderdonk served under Col. A. Hawkes Hay. He was stationed at Dwas Brook and Closter, Bergen Co. NJ. Others mentioned in pension: Roelif and Abraham Van Houten, both of Clarkstown.

Rev. Isaac D. Cole, Minister of the Tappan RDC, "there are no marriage records from 1754-1784 at the United Congregation RDC of Tappan and Clarkstown, Rockland Co; NY." ♦ 03 Sep 1837, Rebecca Paul, age 56, of Clarkstown, wife of John Paul, and the d/o Johannis Remson and his first wife. ♦ 11 Sep 1837, Jane Blauvelt, age 88, a resident of Orange Twp, Rockland Co NY, and sister of Anne Clark (*sic*) (Anne DeClark?). All testifying as fellow soldiers in the Revolution, all of Clarkstown.

♦ 19 Sep 1837, Resolvert Stevens, age 85, served under Capt. Garret Onderdonk. ♦ 19 Sep 1837, Peter Stevens, age 76, served in Bergen Co. NJ, under 1st Lt. Resolvert Van Houten, 2nd Lt. Andries Onderdonk. ♦ 22 Jan 1839, Cornelius DePew, age 78.

## **TUSCARORAS IN RAMAPO**

A little known book by J. C. Storms, published in 1936, chronicles the origin of the mountain people known today as the Ramapough Indian tribe.

He states that the region was originally a favorite resort of the Hackensack Indians, part of the Leni Lenipe family of Iroquois. They had practically disappeared by the end of the seventeenth century.

A colony of German settlers in the northeastern part of North Carolina had encroached on Tuscarora land. The Indians plotted a bloody massacre which was put down with the help of riflemen from South Carolina. After suffering great losses they sued for peace. A treaty was signed October 8, 1711.

The first real permanent population was in 1714 - a remnant of the Tuscarora Indians.

The Indians began to drift away. A record from London in 1761 noted they were moving to New York, invited by Sir William Johnson to unite with his people. Money and provisions were advanced to aid their trip. In the early part of the 19th century a final trek took place, joining their kinsmen, the Iroquois.

A stop was made in the Ramapos for a time on the way to Onondaga northeast of Utica. A few remained for a time in the Ramapos.

Matthew Conklin, progenitor of hundreds of families in the northern Ramapos, had an Indian wife, Phoebe Jane. Descendants believe she was either Mohawk or Onandoga. The census notes that she was born in Orange County about 1790. The possibility exists that her parents were from the Tuscarora tribe, heading for Onondaga.

Today's researchers of the mountain people often differ sharply on long held traditions of their origin.

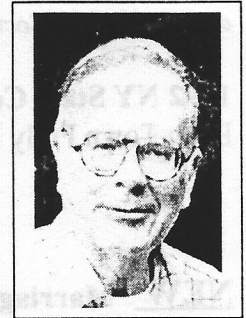

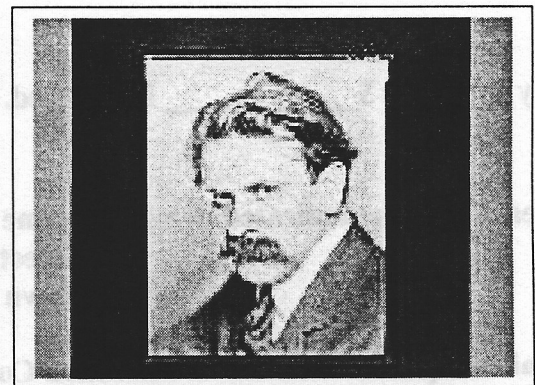
## **LAST WORDS**
