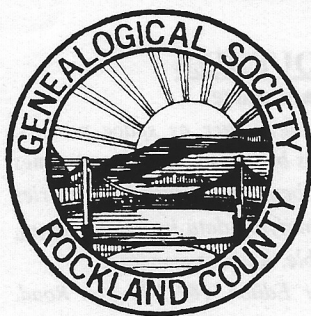

Publications: Dick Peterson reported gross publication sales since our last meeting of \$295.25. A suggestion was made to more adequately publicize our publications.

Indexing: We are still trying to obtain photos of the Martine funeral establishment. There are more White books to be done. Stevenson is almost finished, and we are still attempting to find the first book. Marie Koestler will contact Mr. Stevenson.

John Cullen is continuing to index obituaries, and, as a project of his own, is transcribing a 1922 diary of his father's.

Other notes: Maryann Smith mentioned that there was a burial plot in **Rockland Cemetery** that had been purchased by the "**Order of the Lafayette.**" Some information regarding the organization has been found on the Internet and in an old book at the Cemetery.

The **Rockland County Place Names Project** appears to be more difficult than originally thought, but we will work on it.

Bob Protzmann reported that he has spent some time searching the online database (1840-1920) for the "**Brooklyn Daily Eagle.**" It is a wonderful resource for anyone who has ancestors who lived in Brooklyn.

The business meeting was adjourned at 7:38 p.m., to enjoy a delicious repast before breaking for the holidays.

Does anyone have a copy? MAGGIE GRAVE was the daughter of William Grave and Jane Conklin. She died just short of 100 in Garnerville.

Reply #1 to #485: Hannah Elizabeth CONKLIN.

Re: Hannah CONKLIN (1830-1916) who married George J. W. **Anderson** (1819-1880) - see Dec 2003 Newsletter pg 9, col. 1.

Hannah Elizabeth Conklin was the daughter of Jacob Meyers Conklin of Johnstontown. His gr-daughter Mary Conklin Waldron stated that his father was also Jacob Meyers Conklin, his mother Betsy Finch (Fink?). His dates are uncertain. In 1820 he purchased property from James J. Johnson and his wife Phoebe Secor (38-174). He may have come from New Jersey. His first wife was Sally Tremper, his second Hannah Parker, his third the mother of Hannah.

HANNAH may be the gr-daughter of Nicholas W. Conklin of Ladentown who died 1835, age 80 "or upwards." He had sons Daniel and Henry. If I knew the names of the Anderson children they might be a clue. Deborah Laden, a daughter of Nicholas W., is buried in the Bower of Rest Cemetery in Ladentown, Rockland Co., NY. I'd like to know if Hannah is buried in the same plot or nearby.

The numbering system used is as follows (Ahnentafel). The submitter is always #1. The father's number is double that of his child. The wife's number is one more than her husband. Even numbers are always male, odd numbers are always female except for #1, which is always assigned to the submitter. If you have comments, corrections, additions, etc., to a published ancestor table, please send them to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these comments and corrections, etc., in the Ancestor Table Forum, as space permits.

TUXEDO METHODIST CHURCH

The building of Tuxedo Park brought a flood of workmen to the area. St. Mary's on the Hill (Arden) served the many Italian, Polish and Irish immigrants who built the miles of stone walls and handsome hilltop residences. Other workmen were Protestant, brought up in the Methodist tradition.

They organized a Methodist Society, meeting first in a store and then in the Town Hall. Pierre Lorillard, who had purchased large acreage to form the Tuxedo Park Association, felt that the Methodists needed a more suitable home. The Tuxedo Park Association donated land for a church. Its small congregation had difficulty raising enough money to meet expenses. For most of its history it shared a pastor with the Sloatsburg Methodist Church.

By the middle of the 20th century there was little new building in the Park, and the congregation dwindled. In 1988 only 12 remained. It was decided to dissolve the body and the church was deconsecrated. The deed specified that the land be returned to the TPA if it was no longer used for a church. After lengthy negotiations it was agreed that it would become a history museum for the Town of Tuxedo.

Records of Tuxedo residents prior to 1900 are in the Sloatsburg United Methodist register.

MOUNTAIN MISCELLANY

A good place to berry pick was at a spring called COLD SPRING, near Eagle Rock. It was also called WEeping SPRING - perhaps because little children who were taken along to pick became tired and started to "weep." Many of the swamps in the mountains were flooded by beaver from time to time. Some people broke up the dams because the high water created from the ponds killed the huckleberries. Wild huckleberries were an important cash crop for the mountain farmers.

The amount of charcoal that could be made from a tree depended on the type of tree. Oak yields about 28% of its bulk. Locust is also good but not much grew in Pine Meadow.

Near Green Swamp was a place called SKEEDADDLE ROCK. Some men hid out there to escape being drafted for the Civil War. They occupied themselves with making baskets and scoops which their relatives sold for them. Many did not understand the reasons for the War.

(Some notes about Van Atta family from Anonymous, who warns that the claims are unverified):

Catherine Van Atta's mother was Horie (spelling uncertain), thought to be of German origin. Her father came to New Jersey to take charge of charcoal burning for the Ryersons (Hewitt estate). A Robert Van Atta married a Thompson - his relation not known. A Peter worked in the Ramapo Steel Works, moved to New York. St. Johns Church - Greenwood (Arden) register shows the baptism of Maree Eime Rose Vanatta, d/o Elmer Vanetta and Winfred Babcock, in 1921 at their residence in Harriman NY. She was born in Arcadia FL in 1920.

Robert Vanatter and wife Mary A. had all their children baptised in 1885 at Sterling (Scott Mine Methodist). Scott Mine, Southfields and Sloatsburg records are all in the Sloatsburg register. The children were Ira 1877, Hester Jane 1879, Angeline 1881, Mary Ellen 1883, and Arvilla 1885. Note the spelling variations - Vanatta and Vanatter.

"In them days whenever I wanted to go to Albany, I'd leave my home on The Cat Ladder (now Cross Mountain). I'd go through the village of Lumberville, (now Arena) and take the train at Arkville (Now Dean's Corners). We'd ride through Beaver Dam (now Roxbury) and go through Moresville (now Grand Gorge). Then we'd continue on to Devil's Halfacre (now Stamford). We rode down the West Branch to Tinkertown (now Hobart) and then to "The Bunghole" (now Bloomville). From here we went over the mountain to Klipnockie (Oneonta) where we caught the Albany. They might have added that when he got to Alameda the name was changed to South Kortright and the

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Middletown sign on the post office had been changed to Margaretville."

The **History Archives & Library of the Staten Island Institute of Arts & Sciences** features many collections of interest to genealogists. The Biographies Collection includes letters, clippings, photographs, and biographical data on Staten Islanders, 1851-1945. Staten Island Families holds Wills 1787-1863, Letters of Administration and Guardianship Papers of Richmond County, and Indexes to Wills and Letters of Administration from the County Clerk's Office. Court papers, indentures, mortgage papers, receipts, family letters, birth, death and marriage records, Family Bibles and family genealogies are also onsite. The Vosburgh Cemetery Records include inscriptions of many Staten Island gravestones from the late 1600s to the early 1900s. The Richmond County Records Collection includes Justice of the Peace Dockets, 1706-1896; County Coroner papers, 1787 and 1879; and Proceedings of the Board of Supervisors, 1877-1897.
