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### MINUTES OF GSRC MEETING

Tuesday, September 28, 2004

#### New City Library

The meeting was called to order at 7:06 p.m. by President Michael Secora.

**Treasurer's Report:** Bob Protzmann reported a balance in our checking account of \$10,899.65.

**Membership:** Bob reported a total of 85 paid members so far; total current membership, including complimentary, 95.

**Publications:** Les Baisley reported that some publications were sold over the summer, but it had been slow. They are just now picking up.

**Indexing:** Les Baisley reported that the Martine Funeral Home and Stevenson Funeral Home records have been published. We are still working on Shankey, Lord & White, and Wyman-Fisher. There are still two more Shankey books that we don't have, and Bob Protzmann will contact

Michael Wicks once more to see if we can get them. Following the publication of the above, we will probably work on cemeteries.

Jack Cullen stated that the 1893 records of the Nyack Sewer Project are out being proofed by George and Ruth Fee.

**Announcements:** Mike noted some brochures on the table indicating some upcoming programs. **GREENWOOD**

I would appreciate any help in locating the Death Record of **Richard Booth Greenwood** (died 29 March 1825, Haverstraw, Rockland Co., NY) and the Birth Record of **Joseph Madison Greenwood** (born 18 January 1824, Haverstraw, Rockland Co., NY). Richard was buried in Nyack (ref. Burial Record at Green-Wood Cemetery). His body was later removed to the Green-Wood Cemetery, probably upon the death of his wife, Mary Murphy Greenwood (died 14 December 1875, Brooklyn, Kings Co., NY). Joseph was born in Haverstraw, his family having moved from New York City sometime after the 1820 U.S. Census was completed.

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**Glossary of German Terms and Expressions**

(contr. by *Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot*, from page 12 of: *Karl Stumpp* (1896-1982), "The Emigration from Germany to Russia in the years 1763 to 1862" (1973, pub. in English by the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia, Lincoln, Neb.; 1018 pages). This list refers to some of the terms found in Stumpp's researches of these emigrations. The book names some 20,000 families and uncounted individuals, with home towns and destination towns, and is somewhat indexed. If you had relatives who may have been Germans in Russia, this may be worth reviewing. Karl Stumpp's researches were used by Hitler during WW II to identify and collect Jews in Russia - see more on the web by searching on his name. - Ed.)

We conclude here our series on the **Proceedings of the Board of Supervisors with Town Licenses, 1890**, from the excellent series of photocopies, from old Rockland County Archives books, contributed by Maryann Smith. Besides its historical value, these papers can place your ancestor at a particular time and place in Rockland County.

Earlier pages from Ms. Smith's contribution were published in the March and September issues of 2004. Ms. Smith found some books missing, and for 1866, 1879 and 1890 we have the Licenses but not the Accounts. Perhaps those will turn up in some future search of the county archives.

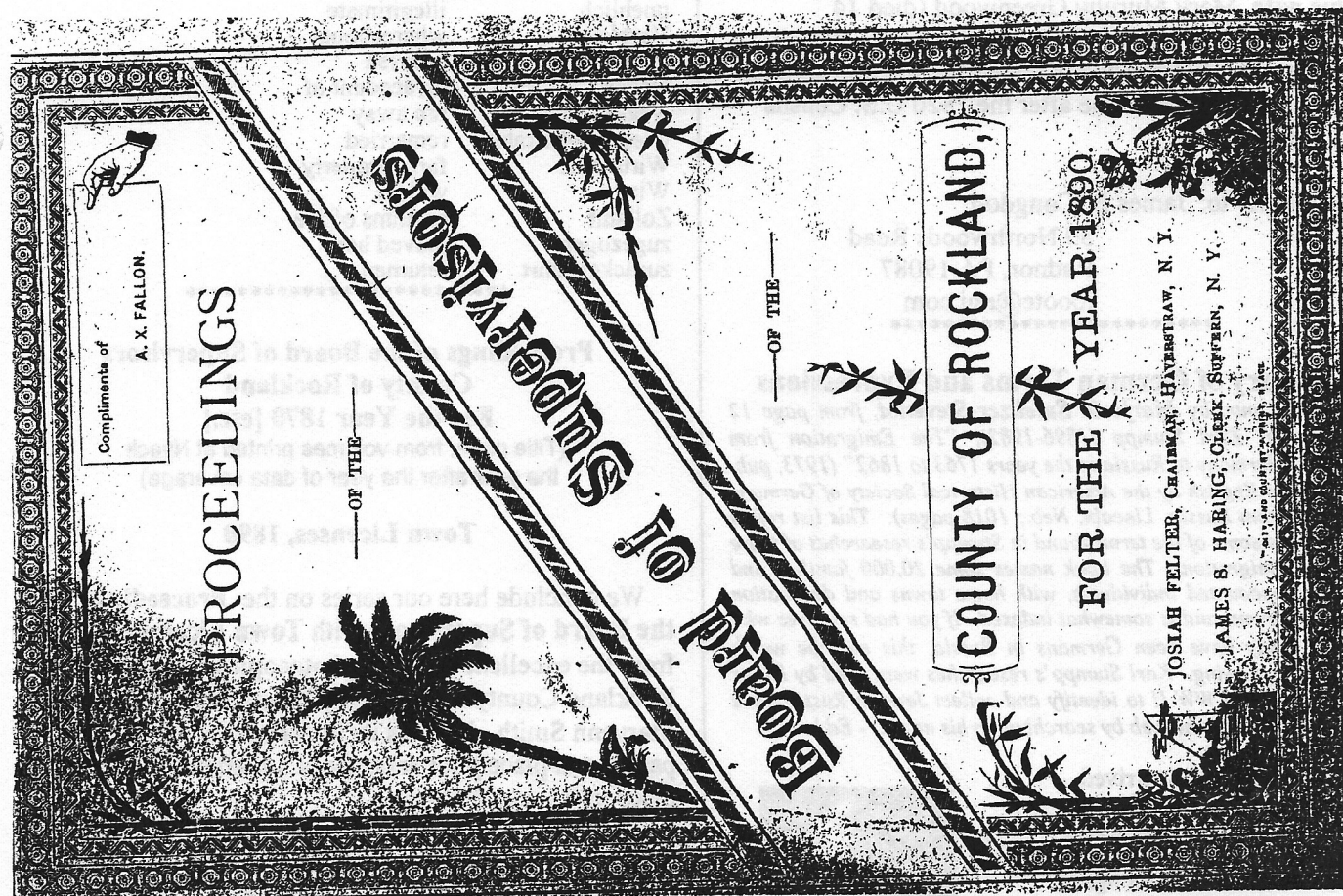

**THE FIRST MAP  
OF PATERSON, NJ**

*"Who Owned the Land Now Embraced  
in the City of Paterson*

*One Hundred and Seventy-Two Years Ago"  
(from a Paterson/Passaic area newspaper ~ 1885)*

Judge Henry P. SIMMONS, of Passaic, is without doubt the best of our local antiquaries. He has in his possession documents of almost priceless value, including the original "*Acquackanonk Patent*," of which so much has been said of late. One of the most interesting of the Judge's possessions is the first map of Paterson, made in 1713, or one hundred and seventy-two years ago. Of course Paterson was then no "city," but this map covers the land now embraced by the City of Paterson. It is, in fact, a map of the farm tracts of all the original proprietors of the "*Boght*" (or bend) of the Passaic River, Paterson now lying in said "*Boght*."

This map was made in 1713--as already stated--by Jan VAN KERRICK (John from the Church). It was found by Judge Simmons among about three bushels of old papers contained in an old tea chest which came into his possession at the time of his marriage, having been the former property of Gerrit GERRITSON (or VAN WAGONER), the ancestor of Judge Simmon's wife, who appears to have been a person of prime consideration among our "first settlers."

In the original patent, there were fourteen proprietors to whom 14 farms were laid out in the Acquackanonk section; fourteen in the Wesel section (that where Cedar Lawn and vicinity now lies) and 28 in the "Boght" or bend. The map referred to represents these last 28 farms.

They are laid out on each side of a straight division line (which the Judge says is about the line of the present Broadway), 18 being on the north and 15 on the south side. The names of these first proprietors of the lands in this city were as follows:

Beginning at the west end of the division line (say Broadway), just under the "steep rocks and mountain," we have the farm of Magiel VRELANT (VREELAND, or FREELAND), which is a triangular plot, the rest being parallel-grams. This first plot is 27 chains, 27 links along the line spoken of.

No. 2 (we go east now) was Leyes VRELANT, 11 chains and 55 links (all these measurements being along the line spoken of);

No. 3, 10 chains, 60 links, was Hendric POST,

No. 4, 10 chains, 27 links was Heimus POST,

No. 5, 10 chains, 19 links, belonged to Hessel PIETERSE and (the latter was the ancestor of Mrs. Judge Simmons.)

No. 6, 11 chains, Jan VAN BLARCOM. (This property Judge Simmons says is in the VAN BLARCOM family yet.)

No. 7, 12 chains, 21 links, Abram TOMASSE (or VAN RIPER).

No. 8, 13 chains, Henderic SPIER.

No. 9, 14 chains, and No. 10, 19 chains, Derric VAN HOUIE.

No. 11, 21 chains, A IRIANSE,

No. 12, 18 chains, 35 links, POST (no Christian name given).

No. 13, 37-1/2 chains, Cornelis GERRITSE.

The farms on the south side of the dividing line were (beginning at the west end under the rocks),

No. 1, Franz POST, 11 chains;

No. 2, Hessel PEITERSE, 12 chains, 33 links;

In this interesting map, the dividing line east and west--which we may designate Broadway, though there was not Broadway or any other street then--is bisected at about the middle of the map by a straight line which Judge Simmons says is the old "York Road" or road to New York, which is perpetuated by the present "York Avenue." This road ran south into what is now Willis Street, past Vreeland Avenue, and straight over the hill to the river. At the point of intersection of the two lines spoken of lay the farms of Simeion VAN WINCKEL and Magiel VRELAND, on the south, and Abram THOMASSE, and Henderic SPIER on the north.

No doubt the transcript we have given of this valuable old map will be read with great interest by all the denizens of the great city which has now absorbed these ancient farms, and especially by the many descendant residents here of the honored pioneers who more than a hundred and seventy-two years ago owned the lands of the "Boght." --Press.
