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Celebrate ! 20th Anniversary The Genealogical Society of Rockland County

It was in September of 1985 at a meeting of the Historians Roundtable that the late John Scott, then Vice President of The Historical Society of Rockland County, reported that there had been many queries about a genealogical society. John suggested that it was time to form one; two members of the group volunteered to serve as chairmen on the new venture.

The first meeting of this newly-formed group was held the next month with acting chairman, Marie Koestler, and co-chairman, Patricia Kerner. After introductions, Isabelle Savell, Senior Historian of the Historical Society, introduced our first guest speaker – William A. Owen, Ph.D., Professor and Dean Emeritus at Columbia University. Dr. Owen spoke about his research in tracing his ancestors through nine states -- from Pennsylvania to Texas and the culmination of his work in "A Fair and Happy Land."

After the program, the interested group discussed the steps necessary to organize the society. A name was chosen, The Genealogical Society of Rockland County; committees were formed to develop the aims and goals of the society (Claire McVickar Ward; Martha Graham, Roland Mills, Christine Adams, and Marie Koestler); by-laws were to be proposed (Henry Rennie, Eugene Head and Tom Casey); Publicity (Robert Knight), and Thomas F. X. Casey volunteered to be temporary treasurer.

Of the 55 organizing members, five have remained active as officers or trustees; eleven are deceased; of the remaining 39, many have moved out of the area but are dues-paying members, and others are no longer working on their genealogies.

The second meeting of the new society was held January 28, 1986; nominations and election of the first officers took place and members volunteered to serve as chairmen of the various committees:

Over the course of these 20 years, GSRC has been incorporated, has a tax-exempt status, and has a database of over 20,000 records of burials in Rockland County. Records of five funeral homes have been computerized and published. Other publications include "Burials at Brick Church Cemetery, 1774-1996," "1892 New York State Census for Rockland County" (the five townships), "Marriages and Deaths in Rockland County, July 1847-December 1859," and a "Book of Lists for Rockland County, Volume #1, Jury Lists from 1798 to 1834."

There have been many informative programs and presentations at the regular meetings, and over a period of four years a "Gathering" was held for interested family historians and genealogists to meet and take part in events. The program was put on hold last year in order to take part in an October 2005 program, "Crossing the Boundaries," an all-day conference focusing on the people and history of lower New York and northern New Jersey, sponsored by the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society in conjunction with The Genealogical Group of New York & New Jersey.

Along with the presentation of *Bare Mountains*, was an exhibit created by Mr. Shook entitled *Gone But Not Forgotten*. The exhibit showed the history of ice industry which once thrived at Rockland Lake, stories of the inhabitants of what is now the Park (PIPC) and the story of neighboring Davies Farm and Jan & Niles Davies, Jr., the 3rd generation of Davies to run the farm, one of the last in Rockland County.
